12	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	
13	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new	
14	section, designated §18A-4-1b, to read as follows:	
15	ARTICLE 4. SALARIES, WAGES AND OTHER BENEFITS.	
16	§18A-4-1b. Graduated salary increase for service personnel beginning in 2015.	
17	The Legislature finds that it is in the best interest of the state to pay employees a competitive	
18	salary. Therefore, the following adjustments to the state minimum salaries for service employees	
19	shall be made:	
20	(1) Beginning July 1, 2015, the minimum monthly pay for each service employee shall be	
21	in accordance with section eight-a of this article, plus an additional \$50.	
22	(2) Beginning July 1, 2016, the minimum monthly pay for each service employee shall be	

- 1 in accordance with section eight-a of this article, plus an additional \$100.
- 2 (3) Beginning July 1, 2017, the minimum monthly pay for each service employee shall be
- 3 in accordance with section eight-a of this article, plus an additional \$150.
- 4 (4) Beginning July 1, 2018, the minimum monthly pay for each service employee shall be
- 5 in accordance with section eight-a of this article, plus an additional \$200.
- 6 (5) Beginning July 1, 2019, and continuing thereafter, the minimum monthly pay for each
- 7 service employee shall be in accordance with section eight-a of this article, plus an additional \$250.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to increase pay to school service personnel on a graduated basis over the next five years, so that the total pay increase after five years is \$250 monthly, which works out to \$3,000 in annual salary.

This section is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
