(BY DELEGATE(S) MR. SPEAKER (MR. ARMSTEAD) AND MILEY)

[BY REQUEST OF THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE]

[Introduced February 6, 2015; referred to the Committee on Education; and then to the Committee on Finance.]

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §18A-3-1d; and to amend and reenact §18A-3-2a of said code; and to amend and reenact §18C-4A-1, §18C-4A-2, and §18C-4A-3 of said code, all relating to education; providing for critical need alternative teaching certificates to teach in subject areas, public schools or geographic areas of the state in which a critical teacher shortage exists, as determined by the State Board of Education; setting forth certificate eligibility requirements; providing for orientation program for critical need alternative teaching certificate holder;

providing for training, support and evaluation of critical need alternative teaching certificate holder; setting forth requirements for renewing critical need alternative teaching certificate; requiring State Board of Education to promulgate legislative rule or rules related to implementation of critical need alternative learning certificates; expanding class of teachers that are eligible to receive assistance from Underwood-Smith Teacher Loan Assistance Program; and increasing annual amount of assistance available from Underwood-Smith Teacher Loan Assistance Program.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §18A-3-1d; that §18A-3-2a of said code be amended and reenacted; and that §18C-4A-1, §18C-4A-2 and §18C-4A-3 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

CHAPTER 18A. SCHOOL PERSONNEL.

ARTICLE 3. TRAINING, CERTIFICATION, LICENSING, PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT.

§18A-3-1d. Critical need alternative teaching certificate.

- 1 (a) The State Superintendent may issue a critical need
- 2 alternative teaching certificate to endorse a candidate to serve as

- 3 teacher of record for a specific instructional field identified as a
- 4 <u>critical need pursuant to subsection (b) of this section.</u>
- 5 (b) The critical need alternative teaching certificate is only
- 6 valid for the purposes of allowing the certificate holder to teach
- 7 in subject areas, public schools or geographic areas of the state
- 8 in which the state board determines that a critical teacher
- 9 shortage exists: *Provided*, That a certified teacher shall be given
- 10 preference to fill any position identified as a critical need over a
- 11 person holding a critical need alternative teaching certificate.
- 12 The state board shall establish criteria and procedures for
- 13 identifying critical teacher shortages in subject areas, public
- 14 schools and geographic areas of the state. In establishing the
- 15 criteria and procedures, the state board shall communicate with
- 16 the Higher Education Policy Commission as it establishes its
- 17 criteria and procedures for identifying critical teacher shortages
- 18 for the purposes of the Underwood-Smith Teacher Scholarship
- 19 and Loan Assistance Fund pursuant to section one, article four,
- 20 chapter eighteen-c of this code.
- 21 (c) The critical need alternative teaching certificate is issued
- 22 for two years and may be renewed for additional one-year

- 23 periods thereafter. The critical need alternative teaching
- 24 certificate is equivalent to a professional teaching certificate for
- 25 the purpose of issuing a continuing contract, and for the purposes
- 26 of being designated a highly qualified teacher under the No
- 27 Child Left Behind Act.
- 28 (d) To be eligible for a critical need alternative teaching
- 29 certificate, an applicant shall:
- 30 (1) Possess a bachelor's degree from an accredited
- 31 <u>institution of higher education, including a bachelor's degree</u>
- 32 <u>based upon verification by a West Virginia Department of</u>
- 33 Education-approved foreign credential evaluating agency, with
- 34 <u>a minimum cumulative 2.75 grade point average in a field or</u>
- 35 subject area related to the area in which the individual seeks
- 36 certification, and have:
- 37 (A) Full-time, professional work experience of at least five
- 38 years or more in a related area or field for which certification is
- 39 being sought;
- 40 (B) Taught full-time in a private school, parochial or other
- 41 school approved for the instruction of students of compulsory
- 42 <u>school age pursuant to section one, article eight, chapter eighteen</u>

- 43 of this code, for at least three years in a related subject area for
- 44 which certification is being sought; or
- 45 (C) An advanced degree, including, but not limited to, a
- 46 <u>master's or doctorate degree, in a field or subject area related to</u>
- 47 the area for which certification is being sought;
- 48 (2) Meet the proficiency score or scores on the state
- 49 competency exam or exams in preprofessional skills or qualify
- 50 for an exemption pursuant to section 10.1.b.3.F.1 of state board
- 51 policy 5202;
- 52 (3) Meet the proficiency score or scores on the state
- 53 competency exam or exams in content or qualify for an
- 54 exemption pursuant to section 10.1.b.3.F.2 of state board policy
- 55 5202 in the area for which he or she is seeking certification or
- 56 provide acceptable documentation or related life experiences to
- 57 the entity providing the program for those content areas that do
- 58 not have a required competency exam;
- 59 (4) Be of good moral character and physically, mentally and
- 60 emotionally qualified to perform the duties of a teacher; and
- 61 (5) Complete a West Virginia State Police and Federal
- 62 Bureau of Investigation criminal history record check and give

- 63 written consent to the West Virginia Department of Education
- 64 pursuant to section ten, article three, chapter eighteen-a of this
- 65 code and state board rules.
- (e) Candidates certified under this section shall complete an
- 67 orientation program developed by the state board prior to
- 68 beginning employment in any school. A fee may be charged to
- 69 candidates for the orientation program to defer the costs of
- 70 administering such program.
- 71 (f) Candidates certified under this section shall successfully
- 72 participate in a comprehensive system of support pursuant to
- 73 section three, article three-c of this chapter during the time the
- 74 candidate is certified pursuant to this section.
- 75 (g) Training and support of teachers certified under this
- 76 section are provided by a professional support team.
- 77 (1) The professional support team shall include the following
- 78 <u>members:</u>
- 79 <u>(i) The school principal, or his or her designee;</u>
- 80 (ii) A master teacher, mentor, academic coach, or other
- 81 individual employee or professional used to provide support,
- 82 supervision, professional development or training to other

- 83 employees pursuant to the comprehensive system of support
- 84 required by section three, article three-c of this chapter; and
- 85 (iii) A teacher education faculty from an institution of higher
- 86 education teacher preparation program, to serve in an advisory
- 87 and guidance capacity.
- 88 (2) The school principal, or his or her designee, serves as
- 89 chairperson of the team.
- 90 (3) The professional support team shall submit a written
- 91 evaluation of the teacher certified under this section to the
- 92 county superintendent at the conclusion of the teacher's first and
- 93 second year of teaching. The written evaluations shall be in a
- 94 form specified by the county superintendent and submitted on a
- 95 date specified by the county superintendent. The evaluations
- 96 shall report the progress of the critical need alternative teacher
- 97 toward meeting the requirements of the training and support
- 98 program, and all final decisions on the progress of the teacher
- 99 and recommendations rest with the principal. The written
- 100 evaluation required by this subdivision is in addition to the
- evaluation required pursuant to section two, article three-c of this
- 102 chapter.

103	(h) A critical need alternative teaching certificate shall be
104	issued only in subject areas, public schools and geographic areas
105	in which the state board determines that critical teacher
106	shortages exist pursuant to subsection (b) of this section, and
107	according to the specialization and appropriate grade levels as
108	set forth in state board rules. Critical need alternative teaching
109	certificates issued pursuant to this section shall not be endorsed
110	for elementary or middle school education except by special
111	approval of the State Superintendent.
112	(i) The critical need alternative teaching certificate shall be
113	valid for two school years and may be renewed for additional
114	one-year periods. The critical need alternative teaching
115	certificate shall be renewed if the holder:
116	(1) Is successfully participating in a comprehensive system
117	of support pursuant to section three, article three-c of this
118	<u>chapter;</u>
119	(2) Participates in required professional development
120	activities designed and implemented by an institution of higher
121	education and the school system;
122	(3) Participates in an additional six hours of professional
123	dayalanment in nedagagy and classroom management:

(4) Receives an evaluation rating at a level above 124 125 unsatisfactory pursuant to section two, article three-c of this 126 chapter and the state board rules promulgated pursuant to that 127 section; and 128 (5) Receives the recommendation of the county 129 superintendent of the county in which the applicant is employed. 130 (i) The state board shall promulgate a legislative rule or rules 131 in accordance with article three-b, chapter twenty-nine-a of this 132 code to implement the provisions of this section, including but 133 not limited to, certificate eligibility criteria, development of an 134 orientation program for candidates certified under this section 135 and any fee required therefor, and the renewal of a certificate. 136 The proposed rule or rules shall be submitted to the Legislative 137 Oversight Commission on Education Accountability for review 138 pursuant to section nine, article three-b, chapter twenty-nine-a of 139 this code.

§18A-3-2a. Certificates valid in the public schools that may be issued by the state superintendent.

- 1 In accordance with state board rules for the education of
- 2 professional educators adopted pursuant to section one of this
- 3 article and subject to the limitations and conditions of that

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- 4 section, the state superintendent may issue the following
- 5 certificates valid in the public schools of the state:
- 6 (a) Professional teaching certificates. —
- 7 (1) A professional teaching certificate for teaching in the
- 8 public schools may be issued to a person who meets the
- 9 following conditions:
- 10 (A) Holds at least a bachelor's degree from an accredited
- 11 institution of higher education in this state, and
- 12 (i) Has completed a program for the education of teachers
- 13 which meets the requirements approved by the state board; or
- 14 (ii) Has met equivalent standards at institutions in other
- 15 states and has passed appropriate state board approved basic
- 16 skills and subject matter tests or has completed three years of
- 17 successful experience within the last seven years in the area for
- 18 which licensure is being sought; or
- 19 (B) Holds at least a bachelor's degree in a discipline taught
- 20 in the public schools from an accredited institution of higher
- 21 education, and
- 22 (i) Has passed appropriate state board approved basic skills
- 23 and subject matter tests; or

- 24 (ii) Has completed three years of successful experience
- 25 within the last seven years in the area for which licensure is
- 26 being sought; and
- 27 (I) Has completed an alternative program for teacher
- 28 education approved by the state board,
- 29 (II) Is recommended for a certificate in accordance with the
- 30 provisions of sections one-a and one-b of this article relating to
- 31 the program, or
- 32 (III) Is recommended by the state superintendent based on
- 33 documentation submitted.
- 34 (2) The certificate shall be endorsed to indicate the grade
- 35 level or levels or areas of specialization in which the person is
- 36 certified to teach or to serve in the public schools.
- 37 (3) The initial professional certificate is issued provisionally
- 38 for a period of three years from the date of issuance:
- 39 (A) The certificate may be converted to a professional
- 40 certificate valid for five years subject to successful completion
- 41 of a beginning teacher internship or induction program, if
- 42 applicable; or
- 43 (B) The certificate may be renewed subject to rules adopted
- 44 by the state board.

- 45 (b) Alternative program teacher certificate. An
- 46 alternative program teacher certificate may be issued to a
- 47 candidate who is enrolled in an alternative program for the
- 48 education of teachers in accordance with the provisions of
- 49 section one-a of this article.
- 50 (1) The certificate is valid only for the alternative program
- 51 position in which the candidate is employed and is subject to
- 52 enrollment in the program.
- 53 (2) The certificate is valid for one year and may be renewed
- 54 for each of the following two consecutive years only.
- 55 (c) Critical need alternative teaching certificate. A
- 56 critical need alternative teaching certificate may be issued to a
- 57 candidate in accordance with the provisions of section one-d of
- 58 this article.
- 59 (1) The certificate is valid, subject to the provisions of
- 60 section one-d of this article.
- 61 (2) The certificate is valid for two years and may be renewed
- 62 <u>for additional one-year periods thereafter.</u>
- 63 (c) (d) Professional administrative certificate. —

- 64 (1) A professional administrative certificate, endorsed for
- 65 serving in the public schools, with specific endorsement as a
- 66 principal, vocational administrator, supervisor of instructions or
- 67 superintendent, may be issued to a person who has completed
- 68 requirements all to be approved by the state board as follows:
- 69 (A) Holds at least a master's degree from an institution of
- 70 higher education accredited to offer a master's degree; and
- 71 (i) Has successfully completed an approved program for
- 72 administrative certification developed by the state board in
- 73 cooperation with the chancellor for higher education, and
- 74 (ii) Has successfully completed education and training in
- 75 evaluation skills through the center for professional
- 76 development, or equivalent education and training in evaluation
- 77 skills approved by the state board, and
- 78 (iii) Possesses three years of management level experience.
- 79 (2) Any person serving in the position of dean of students on
- 80 June 4, 1992, is not required to hold a professional
- 81 administrative certificate.
- 82 (3) The initial professional administrative certificate is
- 83 issued provisionally for a period of five years. This certificate
- 84 may be converted to a professional administrative certificate

- 85 valid for five years or renewed, subject to the regulations of the
- 86 state board.
- 87 (d) (e) Paraprofessional certificate. A paraprofessional
- 88 certificate may be issued to a person who meets the following
- 89 conditions:
- 90 (1) Has completed thirty-six semester hours of
- 91 post-secondary education or its equivalent in subjects directly
- 92 related to performance of the job, all approved by the state
- 93 board; and
- 94 (2) Demonstrates the proficiencies to perform duties as
- 95 required of a paraprofessional as defined in section eight, article
- 96 four of this chapter.
- 97 (e) (f) Other certificates; permits. —
- 98 (1) Other certificates and permits may be issued, subject to
- 99 the approval of the state board, to persons who do not qualify for
- 100 the professional or paraprofessional certificate.
- 101 (2) A certificate or permit may not be given permanent status
- and a person holding one of these credentials shall meet renewal
- 103 requirements provided by law and by regulation, unless the state
- 104 board declares certain of these certificates to be the equivalent
- 105 of the professional certificate.

- 106 (3) Within the category of other certificates and permits, the
 107 state superintendent may issue certificates for persons to serve
 108 in the public schools as athletic coaches or coaches of other
 109 extracurricular activities, whose duties may include the
 110 supervision of students, subject to the following limitations:
- 111 (A) The person is employed under a contract with the county 112 board of education.
- 113 (i) The contract specifies the duties to be performed, 114 specifies a rate of pay that is equivalent to the rate of pay for 115 professional educators in the district who accept similar duties 116 as extra duty assignments, and provides for liability insurance 117 associated with the activity; and
- 118 (ii) The person holding this certificate is not considered an 119 employee of the board for salary and benefit purposes other than 120 as specified in the contract.
- (B) A currently employed certified professional educator has
 not applied for the position; and
- 123 (C) The person completes an orientation program designed 124 and approved in accordance with state board rules.
- 125 (f) (g) Teacher-In-Residence Permit. —

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126 (1) A teacher-in-residence permit may be issued to a 127 candidate who is enrolled in a teacher-in-residence program in 128 accordance with an agreement between an institution of higher 129 education and a county board. The agreement is developed 130 pursuant to subsection (f), section one of this article and requires 131 approval by the state board. 132 (2) The permit is valid only for the teacher-in-residence 133 program position in which the candidate is enrolled and is

ARTICLE 4A. UNDERWOOD-SMITH TEACHER LOAN ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

§18C-4A-1. Selection criteria and procedures for loan assistance.

- 1 (a) The Governor shall designate the Higher Education
- 2 Student Financial Aid Advisory Board created by section five,
- 3 article one of this chapter to select recipients to receive
- 4 Underwood-Smith Teacher Loan Assistance Awards.
- 5 (b) The advisory board shall make decisions regarding loan
- 6 assistance pursuant to section one, article four of this chapter and
- 7 the following criteria:

- 8 (A) Eligibility for an award is limited to a teacher who has 9 earned a teaching degree and is certified to teach a subject area 10 of critical need in the public schools of West Virginia. A 11 certified teacher in a subject area of critical need who is enrolled 12 in an advanced in-field degree course or who has earned an advanced in-field degree may apply for an award to be paid 13 toward current education student loans; 14 15 (B) To be eligible for a loan award, a teacher shall agree to
- teach, or shall currently be teaching, a subject area of critical need or in a state school or geographic area of the state identified as an area of critical need pursuant to section one, article four of this chapter. The advisory board shall make decisions regarding loan assistance pursuant to section one, article four of this chapter.
- 22 (c) In accordance with the rule promulgated pursuant to 23 section one, article four of this chapter, the vice chancellor for 24 administration shall develop <u>additional eligibility</u> criteria and 25 procedures for the administration of the loan program.
- 26 (d) The vice chancellor for administration shall make 27 available program application forms to public and private

- 28 schools in the state via the commission and the State Department
- 29 of Education's websites and in other locations convenient to
- 30 potential applicants.

§18C-4A-2. Loan assistance agreement.

- 1 (a) Before receiving an award, each eligible teacher shall
- 2 enter into an agreement with the vice chancellor for
- 3 administration and shall meet the following criteria:
- 4 (1) Provide the commission with evidence of compliance
- 5 with subsection (b), section four, article four of this chapter;
- 6 (2) Teach in a subject area of critical need or in a school or
- 7 geographic area of critical need full time under contract with a
- 8 county board for a period of two school years for each year for
- 9 which loan assistance is received pursuant to this article. The
- 10 vice chancellor for administration may grant a partial award to
- an eligible recipient whose contract term is for less than a full
- 12 school year pursuant to criteria established by commission rule.
- 13 (3) Acknowledge that an award is to be paid to the
- 14 recipient's educational student loan institution, not directly to the
- 15 recipient, only after the commission determines that the recipient
- 16 has complied with all terms of the agreement; and

- 17 (4) Repay all or part of an award received pursuant to this
- 18 article if the award is not paid to the educational student loan
- 19 institution or if the recipient does not comply with the other
- 20 terms of the agreement.
- 21 (b) Each loan agreement shall disclose fully the terms and
- 22 conditions under which an award may be granted pursuant to this
- 23 article and under which repayment may be required. The
- 24 agreement also is subject to and shall include the terms and
- 25 conditions established by section five, article four of this
- 26 chapter.

§18C-4A-3. Amount and duration of loan assistance; limits.

- 1 (a) Each award recipient is eligible to receive loan assistance
- of up to \$2,000 \$3,000 annually subject to limits set forth in
- 3 subsection (b) of this section:
- 4 (1) If the recipient has taught math or science for a full
- 5 school year under contract with a county board in a subject area
- 6 <u>of critical need or</u> in a school or geographic area of critical need;
- 7 and
- 8 (2) If the recipient otherwise has complied with the terms of
- 9 the agreement and with applicable provisions of this article and

- 10 article four of this chapter, and any rules promulgated pursuant
- 11 thereto.
- 12 (b) The recipient is eligible for renewal of loan assistance
- 13 only during the periods when the recipient is under contract with
- 14 a county board to teach in a subject area of critical need or in a
- 15 school or geographic area of critical need, and complies with
- 16 other criteria and conditions established by rule, except that a
- 17 teacher who is teaching under a contract in a position that no
- 18 longer meets the definition of critical need under rules
- 19 established in accordance with section one, article four of this
- 20 chapter is eligible for renewal of loan assistance until the teacher
- 21 leaves his or her current position.
- 22 (c) No recipient may receive loan assistance pursuant to this
- 23 article which accumulates in excess of \$15,000.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish critical need alternative teaching certificates, provide for the requirements to obtain such a certificate and provide criteria for the renewal of such certificates. The bill also expands the availability of the Underwood-Smith Teacher Loan Assistance Program, and increases the annual amount of assistance available from \$2,000 to \$3,000.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

§18A-3-1d is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
