A BILL to amend and reenact §30-13A-4 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to the West Virginia Board of Professional Surveyors; changing requirements for membership on the board; staggering terms; providing for continued service of qualifying board members; providing for the disqualification of certain members who become licensees; and providing that citizen member appointments represent different congressional districts.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §30-13A-4 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

#### **ARTICLE 13A. LAND SURVEYORS.**

#### §30-13A-4. Board of Professional Surveyors.

- (a) The "West Virginia Board of Professional Surveyors" is continued. Any member of the board except the endorsed underground surveyor member, in office on July 1, 2010 2016 may continue to serve until his or her successor has been appointed and qualified.
- (b) Prior to July 1, 2010, the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, shall appoint one licensed professional surveyor with at least ten years of experience in land surveying to replace the endorsed underground surveyor.
- (e) (b) Commencing July 1, 2010, 2016 the board shall consist of the following five members with staggered terms:
- (1) Three <u>Two</u> licensed professional surveyors with at least ten years of experience in land surveying <u>each from a separate congressional district.</u>
- (2) One person who has a license in another field of practice other than surveying and also who has a surveyor license by examination and has practiced surveying for at least ten years; must be a retired, inactive, or emeritus member under the provisions of this article, and may not be licensed to practice under the provisions of this article; and

15	(3) One citizen member who is Two citizen members who are not regulated under the
16	provisions of this article and does do not perform any services related to the practice of surveying

18	(c) Members of the board as of the effective date of this section may continue to serve

- (c) Members of the board as of the effective date of this section may continue to serve their term without regarding to the status of their license until a successor is appointed by the Governor.
- (d) Each licensed member of the board, at the time of his or her appointment, must have held a license in this state for a period of not less than three years immediately preceding the appointment.
- (e) Each member must be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, and must be a resident of this state during the appointment term.
  - (f) The term of each board member is four years.
- (g) No member may serve more than two consecutive full terms and any member having served two full terms may not be appointed for one year after completion of his or her second full term. A member shall continue to serve until his or her successor has been appointed and qualified.
- (h) The Governor may remove any member from the board for neglect of duty, incompetency or official misconduct.
- (i) A licensed member of the board immediately and automatically forfeits membership to the board if his or her license to practice is suspended or revoked.
- (j) Any member who is unlicensed or who holds a retired, inactive, or emeritus license immediately and automatically forfeits his or her membership on the board if he or she obtains an active license that would permit him or her to practice under the provisions of this article, or obtains a similar license from another jurisdiction.
- (j) (k) A member of the board immediately and automatically forfeits membership to the board if he or she is convicted of a felony under the laws of any jurisdiction or becomes a nonresident of this state.

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42	(k) (I) The board shall designate one of its members as chairperson and one member as
43	secretary-treasurer.
44	(I) (m) Each member of the board is entitled to receive compensation and expense

(m) (n) A majority of the members of the board shall constitute a quorum.

reimbursement in accordance with section eleven, article one of this chapter.

(n) (o) The board shall hold at least one annual meeting. Other meetings shall be held at the call of the chairperson, or upon the written request of two members, at such time and place as designated in the call or request.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to amend the qualifications for members of the Board of Surveyors, and by adding one retired, inactive, or emeritus member; and two citizen members and to provide for their removal upon obtaining an active license.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
