## **Senate Bill 18**

FISCAL NOTE

A BILL to amend and reenact §30-7-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to increasing membership of the Board of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses from five to ten members; providing that nine members be registered nurses and one member a public consumer; and setting forth qualifications of those nurses who may serve.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §30-7-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

#### ARTICLE 7. REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSES.

### §30-7-3. Board of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses.

The Governor shall appoint, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, a board consisting of <u>five ten</u> members who shall constitute and be known as the West Virginia Board of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses.

Appointments hereunder shall be made by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, from lists submitted to the Governor by the West Virginia Nurses' Association. Such The lists shall contain the names of at least three persons eligible for membership for each membership or vacancy to be filled and shall be submitted to the Governor on or before June 1 of each year and at such other time or times as a vacancy on the board shall exist exists. Appointments under the provisions of this article shall be for a term of five years each or for the unexpired term, if any, of the present members. Any member may be is eligible for reappointment, but no member shall may serve longer than two successive terms. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as is provided for appointment in the first instance. The Governor may remove any member for neglect of duty, for incompetence, or for unprofessional or dishonorable conduct.

15 Of the ten board members, nine members shall be registered nurses and one member shall be a public consumer. The nine registered nurse members on the board shall be 16 17 apportioned as follows: 18 (1) Three advanced practice registered nurses who are currently and solely in clinical practice and have practiced for a minimum of five years, and which shall include one nurse 19 20 anesthetist, one nurse practitioner and one nurse midwife: 21 (2) Two nursing educators; 22 (3) Two nurse administrators; and 23 (4) Two currently practicing registered nurses who have practiced as a registered nurse 24 for at least five years in any role that provides direct patient care. 25 Each member of the board hereafter appointed shall (a) be a citizen of the United States 26 and a resident of this state, and each registered nurse member shall: (b) 27 (1) Be a graduate from an accredited educational program in this or any other state for the 28 preparation of practitioners of registered professional nursing, or be a graduate from an accredited 29 college or university with a major in the field of nursing; 30 (c) (2) Be a graduate from an accredited college or university; and 31 (d) (3) Be a registered professional nurse licensed in this state or eligible for licensure as 32 such. (e) have had at least five years of experience in teaching in an educational program for the 33 preparation of practitioners of registered professional nursing, or in a combination of such 34 teaching and either nursing service administration or nursing education administration, and (f) 35 have been actually engaged in registered professional nursing for at least three within the past 36 five years preceding his or her appointment or reappointment. 37 Each member of the board shall receive \$50 for each day actually spent in attending 38 meetings of the board, or of its committees, and shall also be reimbursed for actual and necessary 39 expenses. Provided, That the per diem increased by this amendment shall be effective upon

- 40 passage of this article be paid compensation and reimbursed for expenses pursuant to the
- 41 provisions of section eleven, article one of this chapter.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is increase the membership of the Board of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses from five to ten members. The board will be comprised of nine nurse members and one public consumer member. The nurse members will include three advanced practice registered nurses, two registered nurses, two nurse administrators and two nursing educators. The bill also sets forth the qualifications of those nurses who may serve.
