1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

1 That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new 2

ARTICLE 6. CIVIL SERVICE SYSTEM.

section, designated §29-6-29, to read as follows:

§29-6-29. Paid leave for child's education.

- 1 (a) Beginning July 1, 2015, employees covered under this article are eligible each year to
- 2 use not more than four hours of paid leave during normal work hours to attend either:
- 3 (1) A mutually-scheduled parent-teacher conference for the employee's child attending a
- 4 public or private school in grades kindergarten through twelve; or
- 5 (2) A mutually-scheduled parent caregiver conference for the employee's preschool-aged
- 6 child attending a licensed group child care center.
- 7 (b) The employee may take paid leave for no more than two mutually-scheduled
- 8 conferences per child each year. Travel time may be included in the four hours of paid leave
- 9 permitted each year.

- 10 (c) The time taken is not to be credited against an employee's annual or sick leave benefits
- 11 if the employee makes a reasonable, good-faith effort to schedule the time off so as to not unduly
- 12 interfere with the operations of the work unit or require the applicable agency to incur additional
- 13 human resources or overtime costs.
