A BILL to amend and reenact §30-5-34 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating
 to establishing a criminal penalty; permitting the board to contact law enforcement with
 information concerning a criminal offense; prohibiting the practice of pharmacist care
 without a license; prohibiting assistance to practice of pharmacist care without a
 registration; permitting the fining of a person practicing with an encumbered license;
 permitting the fining of a person practicing with an encumbered registration; establishing
 a fine.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

1 That §30-5-34 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and 2 reenacted to read as follows:

§30-5-34. Criminal offenses.

When, as a result of an investigation under this article or otherwise, the board has reason
 to believe that a person authorized under this article has committed a criminal offense the board
 may bring its information to the attention of an appropriate law-enforcement official.

4 (a) When, as a result of an investigation under this article or otherwise, the board has
5 reason to believe that a person authorized under this article has committed a criminal offense
6 under this article, the board may bring its information to the attention of an appropriate law7 enforcement official.

- 8 (b) Any person who intentionally practices, or holds himself or herself out as qualified to 9 practice pharmacist care or to assist in the practice of pharmacist care, or uses any title, word or 10 abbreviation to indicate to or induce others to believe he or she is licensed to practice as a 11 pharmacist or pharmacist technician without obtaining an active, valid West Virginia license to 12 practice that profession; or 13 With a license that is:
- 14 (1) Expired, suspended or lapsed; or
- 15 (2) Inactive, revoked, suspended as a result of disciplinary action, or surrendered;

16 <u>is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than ten thousand</u>

17 <u>dollars.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish a criminal penalty for the unlawful practice of pharmaceutical care.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
