1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, 2 designated §17A-2-24, relating to regional Division of Motor Vehicle offices and self-3 service kiosks; requiring the division to maintain at least one regional office location within 4 twenty-five miles' driving distance of the county seat of any county of a certain population; 5 requiring the division to maintain at least one self-service kiosk within any county below a 6 certain population; requiring the division to conduct an evaluation and report to the Joint 7 Standing Committee on Government Organization regarding the propriety of self-service 8 kiosks to replace regional offices in counties below a certain population; and prohibiting 9 the division from operating more than twenty-five regional offices.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
section, designated §17A-2-24, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 2. DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

§17A-2-24. Requirements for Regional Offices and Self-Service Kiosk Locations.

1 (a) <i>Definitions</i> For the	purposes of this section:
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2 (1) "Driving distance" means the distance of motor vehicle travel upon public highways

3 necessary to reach one location from another, as measured in miles.

- 4 (2) "Regional office" means a Division of Motor Vehicles office where a citizen may 5 complete the administrative procedures that the Division of Motor Vehicles requires to apply for 6 and receive any operators' or chauffeurs' license, identification card, certificate of title, registration 7 card, or any other certification necessary to lawfully own, operate, lease, purchase, alter or sell a 8 motor vehicle in this state. 9 (3) "Self-service kiosk" means an electronic self-service terminal equipped with two-way 10 videoconferencing technology which, to the extent allowed by available technology, allows 11 individuals to complete any and all administrative procedures the Division of Motor Vehicles
- 12 requires to apply for and receive any operators' or chauffeurs' license, identification card,

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- 13 certificate of title, registration card, or any other certification necessary to lawfully own, operate,
- 14 lease, purchase, alter or sell a motor vehicle in this state.
- 15 (b) On or before June 30, 2018, the division will ensure that at least one regional office is
- 16 located within twenty-five miles' driving distance of the county seat of any county with a population
- 17 equal to or greater than 25,000 according to the 2010 United States Census.
- 18 (c) On or before June 30, 2020, the division will ensure that at least one fully-functioning
- 19 self-service kiosk is located within any county with a population of less than 25,000, according to
- 20 the 2010 United States Census. Each self-service kiosk must facilitate videoconference
- 21 <u>communication with a division agent and, to the extent that existing technology allows, offer any</u>
- 22 and all services available at a regional office.
- 23 (d) On or before January 1, 2018, the division will conduct an evaluation into each regional
- 24 office located within a county with a population of less than 25,000, according to the 2010 United
- 25 States Census, to determine whether the services provided by the regional office may be
- 26 effectively provided by a self-service kiosk. The division will provide a written report on the
- 27 findings of each evaluation to the Joint Standing Committee on Government Organization at the
- 28 <u>Committee's first interim meeting occurring after January 1, 2018.</u>
- 29 (e) Effective immediately, the division may not operate more than twenty-five regional
- 30 <u>offices.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require the division to maintain at least one regional office location within twenty-five miles' driving distance of the county seat of any county of a certain population; to require the division to maintain at least one self-service kiosk within any county below a certain population; to require the division to conduct an evaluation and report to the Joint Committee on Government organization regarding the propriety of self-service kiosks to replace regional offices in counties below a certain population; and to prohibit the division from operating more than twenty-five regional offices.
