1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section. 2 designated §30-3-11c, and to amend said code by adding thereto a new section, 3 designated §30-14-8a, all relating to out of state physicians and surgeons traveling with 4 sports teams within this state; authorizing a physician or surgeon who is licensed to 5 practice medicine or osteopathic medicine in another state to provide medical care to 6 sports team members under certain circumstances. Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: 1 That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new 2 section, designated §30-3-11c, and that said code be amended by adding thereto a new section, 3 designated §30-14-8a, all to read as follows: ARTICLE 3. WEST VIRGINIA MEDICAL PRACTICE ACT. §30-3-11c. Limited Authorization to Practice for Traveling Sports Team Physician or Surgeon. (a) A person who holds a current, unrestricted license to practice medicine or surgery in 1 2 another state is exempt from the licensure requirements of this article while providing medical 3 care in this state, if all of the following conditions are met: 4 (1) The physician or surgeon has an oral or written agreement with a sports team to 5 provide general or emergency medical care to the team members; and 6 (2) The physician or surgeon is providing care to the following: 7 (i) A member of the athletic team; 8 (ii) A member of the athletic team's coaching, communications, equipment, or sports 9 medicine staff; 10 (iii) A member of a band or cheerleading squad accompanying the athletic team; or 11 (iv) The athletic team's mascot. 12 (b) In providing medical care pursuant to this section, a physician or surgeon shall not provide medical services at a health care facility, including a hospital, an ambulatory surgical 13

14 facility, or any other facility in which medical care, diagnosis, or treatment is provided on an

15 inpatient or outpatient basis.

#### ARTICLE 14. OSTEOPATHIC PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS.

§30-14-8a. Limited Authorization to Practice for Traveling Sports Team Physician or Surgeon.

1 (a) A person who holds a current, unrestricted license to practice osteopathic medicine 2 or surgery in another state is exempt from the licensure requirements of this article while 3 providing medical care in this state, if all of the following conditions are met: 4 (1) The physician or surgeon has an oral or written agreement with a sports team to 5 provide general or emergency medical care to the team members; and 6 (2) The physician or surgeon is providing care to the following: 7 (i) A member of the athletic team: 8 (ii) A member of the athletic team's coaching, communications, equipment, or sports 9 medicine staff; 10 (iii) A member of a band or cheerleading squad accompanying the athletic team; or 11 (iv) The athletic team's mascot. 12 (b) In providing medical care pursuant to this section, a physician or surgeon shall not 13 provide medical services at a health care facility, including a hospital, an ambulatory surgical facility, or any other facility in which medical care, diagnosis, or treatment is provided on an 14 15 inpatient or outpatient basis.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize a physician or surgeon who is traveling with a sports team and is licensed to practice medicine or osteopathic medicine in another state to provide medical care to sports team members under certain circumstances.
