## House Bill 4391

FISCAL NOTE

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §17B-1-16, relating to issuing identification documents to homeless individuals residing at homeless shelters within this state at no cost; stating legislative intent; defining terms; establishing eligibility requirements for homeless individuals to receive identifying documents at no cost; creating a process by which a homeless individual may apply for certain identifying documents to be provided at no cost; requiring the division to issue certain identifying documents to eligible homeless individuals at no cost; and requiring the commissioner to develop forms.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted by adding thereto a new section, designated §17B-1-16, to read as follows:

#### ARTICLE 2. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE, EXPIRATION AND RENEWAL.

#### §17B-1-16. Identification documents for homeless citizens.

1 <u>(a) Findings.--</u>

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- 2 <u>The Legislature finds that:</u>
  - (1) Individuals who are homeless are often the victims of crimes in which their personal identification documents are stolen or lost; and
- (2) Personal identification documents are necessary for obtaining employment or certain
  public benefits, but the fees for acquiring documents may be prohibitive to a homeless individual;
  and
  - (3) Removing barriers that prevent homeless individuals from obtaining identification documents may enable those individuals to achieve greater financial stability and a permanent home.
- 11 (b) Definitions.--
- 12 <u>For the purposes of this section:</u>
- 13 (1) "Homeless citizen" means an individual who meets the following criteria:

14	(A) The individual is a resident of this state, as defined by section one-a, article three,
15	chapter seventeen-a of this code, and
16	(B) The individual has a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not
17	designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.
18	(2) "Homeless shelter" means a homeless service agency or entity which regularly
19	provides temporary residence for homeless individuals and families.
20	(c) A homeless citizen is eligible to receive certain identification documents at no cost to
21	the citizen, as provided in subsection (d) of this section, if all of the following criteria apply:
22	(1) The homeless citizen currently resides at a homeless shelter in this state;
23	(2) The homeless citizen uses the address of the homeless shelter as his or her address
24	of residence on the application for the identifying document; and
25	(3) An employee or representative from the homeless shelter signs an affidavit stating that
26	the homeless citizen is truly a resident of the homeless shelter and has no other known address.
27	(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article, the division shall issue the following
28	documents to a homeless citizen, meeting the eligibility criteria provided in subsection (c) of this
29	section, at no cost to the citizen:
30	(1) A photo identification card,
31	(2) A replacement driver's license, or
32	(3) A replacement birth certificate: Provided, That the division may not issue more than
33	one identifying document, pursuant to this section, to any particular individual within one thirty day
34	period.
35	(e) The commissioner shall develop forms necessary to carry out the requirements of this
36	section.
	NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require the Division of Motor Vehicles to provide certain identification documents to homeless individuals, residing at homeless shelters within this state, at no cost.
