1	A BILL to repeal §30-14-15 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend and
2	reenact §30-14-14 of said code, relating to the rulemaking authority for Board of
3	Osteopathic Medicine.
	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
1	That §30-14-15 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be repealed; and that
2	§30-14-14 of said code be amended and reenacted, to read as follows:
	ARTICLE 14. OSTEOPATHIC PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS.
	§30-14-14. Separability clause. Rulemaking.
1	The terms of this article are declared to be separable; and should any word, phrase,
2	sentence or section hereof be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, the remainder of this
3	article shall not thereby be affected, but shall remain in full force and effect.
1	(a) The board shall propose rules for legislative approval, in accordance with article three,
2	chapter twenty-nine-a of this code, to implement the provisions of this article, including:
3	(1) Standards and requirements for licenses and permits;
4	(2) Procedures for examinations and reexaminations:
5	(3) Requirements for third parties to prepare or administer, or both, examinations and
6	reexaminations;
7	(4) Educational and experience requirements;
8	(5) Standards for approval of courses and curriculum;
9	(6) Procedures for the issuance and renewal of licenses and permits;
10	(7) A fee schedule;
11	(8) Regulation of osteopathic medical corporations;
12	(9) Regulation of profession limited liability companies;
13	(10) Regulation of osteopathic physician assistants;
14	(11) Continuing education requirements for licensees;
15	(12) The standards for and limitations upon the utilization of telemedicine technologies;

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16	(13) The procedures for denying, suspending, restricting, revoking, reinstating or limiting
17	the practice of licensees and permittees;
18	(14) Adopting a standard for ethics;
19	(15) Requirements for revoked licenses or permits; and
20	(16) Any other rules necessary to effectuate the provisions of this article.
21	(b) All of the board's rules in effect and not in conflict with these provisions shall remain in
22	effect until they are amended or rescinded.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to update the rulemaking authority of the Board of Osteopathic Medicine.
