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- A BILL to amend and reenact §30-7-4 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, and to
 amend and reenact §30-7A-5 of said code, all relating to prohibiting state nursing boards
- 3 from limiting the number of students a nursing school may admit to the school.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

1 That §30-7-4 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and 2 reenacted, and that §30-7A-5 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 7. REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSES.

§30-7-4. Organization and meetings of board; quorum; powers and duties generally; executive secretary; funds.

The board shall meet at least once each year and shall elect from its members a president and a secretary. The secretary shall also act as treasurer of the board. The board may hold such other meetings during the year as it may deem necessary to transact its business. A majority, including one officer, of the board shall constitute a quorum at any meeting. The board is hereby authorized and empowered to:

6 (a) Adopt and, from time to time, amend such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with
7 this article, as may be necessary to enable it to carry into effect the provisions of this article;

8 (b) Prescribe standards for educational programs preparing persons for licensure to
9 practice registered professional nursing under this article;

10 (c) Provide for surveys of such educational programs at such time as it may deem11 necessary;

(d) Accredit such educational programs for the preparation of practitioners of registered
professional nursing as shall meet the requirements of this article and of the board;

(e) Deny or withdraw accreditation of educational programs for failure to meet or maintain
prescribed standards required by this article and by the board;

16 (f) Examine, license and renew the licenses of duly qualified applicants;

17 (g) Conduct hearings upon charges calling for discipline of a licensee or revocation or

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18 suspension of a license;

19 (h) Keep a record of all proceedings of the board;

20 (i) Make a biennial report to the Governor and the Legislative Oversight Commission for
21 Health and Human Resources Accountability;

(j) Appoint and employ a qualified person, who shall not be a member of the board, toserve as executive secretary to the board:

- 24 (k) Define the duties and fix the compensation for the executive secretary; and
- 25 (I) Employ such other persons as may be necessary to carry on the work of the board.

All fees and other moneys collected by the board pursuant to the provisions of this article shall be kept in a separate fund and expended solely for the purpose of this article. No part of this special fund shall revert to the General Funds of this state. The compensation provided by this article and all expenses incurred under this article shall be paid from this special fund. No compensation or expense incurred under this article shall be a charge against the General Funds of this state.

ARTICLE 7A. PRACTICAL NURSES.

§30-7A-5. Board of examiners; powers; duties.

The Governor shall appoint, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, seven citizens of the State of West Virginia who shall constitute the "West Virginia State Board of Examiners for licensed practical nurses" and they shall be charged with the duty of administering the provisions of this article. Of the seven members so appointed two shall be licensed practical nurses, one of whom shall be a graduate of an approved school of practical nursing, and both of whom shall have had not less than five years' experience as licensed practical nurses, two shall be registered professional nurses, at least one of whom shall be experienced in practical nurse

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8 education; one shall be a doctor of medicine; one shall be a hospital administrator actively 9 engaged as such in this state and one shall be a vocational educator. Such appointments shall 10 be for terms of five years each, except that in the initial appointments, one licensed practical nurse 11 and one registered professional nurse shall be appointed for a term of five years, one licensed 12 practical nurse and one registered professional nurse shall be appointed for a term of four years. 13 the doctor of medicine shall be appointed for a term of three years, the hospital administrator shall 14 be appointed for a term of two years and the vocational educator shall be appointed for a term of 15 one year. The practical nurses so to be appointed, initially and subsequently, shall be selected by 16 the Governor from a list to be submitted to him or her by the Licensed Practical Nurses' 17 Association of West Virginia, Inc., which list shall contain the names of at least two licensed 18 practical nurses for each board member so to be appointed, who shall have been licensed by 19 examination and who shall have not less than five years' experience as a licensed practical nurse. 20 The doctor of medicine so appointed shall be selected by the Governor from two nominations 21 submitted to him or her by the West Virginia State Medical Association; each registered 22 professional nurse so appointed shall be selected by the Governor from two nominations 23 submitted to him or her by the West Virginia Nurses Association, Inc.; the hospital administrator 24 shall be appointed by the Governor from two nominations submitted to him or her by the West 25 Virginia Hospital Association; and the vocational educator shall be appointed by the Governor 26 from two nominations submitted to him or her by the State Board of Education. Any member of 27 the board may be eligible for reappointment, but no member shall serve more than two successive 28 terms. The board is hereby authorized to appoint and employ a gualified person to perform the 29 duties of executive secretary and to act as educational advisor to the board. Such secretary shall 30 act under the direction of the board. The board shall furnish the secretary a headquarters and 31 shall provide such office equipment and clerical assistance as the duties of the office may require. 32 The board shall have power to appoint such nurses, deputies, clerks, assistants, inspectors and 33 employees as shall be necessary for the proper exercise of the powers and duties of the board.

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34 The compensation and expenses of the members of the board and its appointees and employees 35 shall be paid out of such funds as are allocated to the board in its annual budget. The secretary 36 shall keep the records of proceedings of the board, and shall keep a registry of the names and 37 addresses of all practical nurses registered under this article, which registry shall be a public 38 record. Said board shall hold not less than two regular meetings each year and such additional 39 meetings at such times and places as the board may determine. The board is authorized to adopt 40 and, from time to time, to revise such rules and regulations not inconsistent with this article, as 41 may be necessary to enable it to carry into effect the provisions hereof. The board shall prescribe 42 curricula and standards for schools and courses preparing persons for licensure under this article. 43 It shall survey such schools and courses at such times as it may deem necessary. It shall survey 44 and accredit such schools, clinical practice areas and courses as meet the requirements of this 45 article and of the board. It shall examine, license and renew the license of duly qualified 46 applicants.
