1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
 2 designated §30-23-31, relating to termination of the West Virginia Medical Imaging and
 3 Radiation Therapy Technology Board of Examiners.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

1 That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
 2 section, designated §30-23-31, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 23. RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGISTS.

**§30-23-31. Termination of the West Virginia Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy
 Technology Board of Examiners.**

1 (a) The West Virginia Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy Technology Board of
 2 Examiners is hereby terminated in accordance with section twelve, article ten, chapter four of this
 3 code. Effective July 1, 2018, the board is eliminated and this article ceases to be effective. Upon
 4 the effective date of this section, the board shall begin the winding up of its affairs and take all
 5 necessary steps to effectuate the termination of the board and its regulation of medical imaging
 6 technologists and radiation therapy technologists.

7 (b) On or before June 30, 2018, the board shall dispose all assets, property, and records
 8 pursuant to section thirteen, article ten, chapter four of this code. All unexpended funds in the
 9 board of Examiners of Medical Imaging Technology Fund shall be transferred into the General
 10 Revenue Fund.

11 (c) Effective July 1, 2018, all legislative rules promulgated by the board in accordance with
 12 section seven of this article shall be terminated and have no further force or effect.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to terminate the West Virginia Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy Technology Board of Examiners.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
