INTRODUCED H.B.

- A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
 designated §5A-8-23, relating to codifying statutory immunity for government agencies
 and officials from actions of third-parties using documents or records of governmental
 agencies for unlawful acts.
 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
- 1 That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
- 2 section, designated §5A-8-23, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 8. PUBLIC RECORDS MANAGEMENT AND PRESERVATION ACT

§5A-8-23. Limitation of liability.

- 1 This article creates no liability upon any person acting in his or her capacity as a state
- 2 officer, employee, or retiree or former employee of the State of West Virginia; or upon the legal
- 3 dependents, heirs and assignees of any such person; nor, upon any agency of the executive,
- 4 legislative, or judicial branch of government of the State of West Virginia, for any transaction which
- 5 is compromised by any illegal act or inappropriate use associated with information regulated by
- 6 this article.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to clarify that there is statutory immunity for government agencies and officials from actions of third-parties using documents or records of governmental agencies for unlawful acts.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
