INTRODUCED 2017R3228

A BILL to amend and reenact §30-36-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; relating to the practice of acupuncture.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §30-36-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 36. ACUPUNCTURISTS.

- 1 (a) Unless the context in which used clearly requires a different meaning, as used in this 2 article:
- (1) "Acupuncture" means a form of health care, based on a theory of energetic physiology,
 that describes the interrelationship of the body organs or functions with an associated point or
 combination of points.
 - (2) "Board" means the West Virginia Acupuncture Board.
- 7 (3) "License" means a license issued by the board to practice acupuncture.
- 8 (4) "Moxibustion" means the burning of mugwort on or near the skin to stimulate the 9 acupuncture point.
- 10 (5) "Practice acupuncture" means the use of oriental medical therapies for the purpose of 11 normalizing energetic physiological functions including pain control, and for the promotion, 12 maintenance and restoration of health.
- 13 (b) (1) "Practice acupuncture" includes:
- 14 (1) (A) Stimulation of points of the body by the insertion of acupuncture needles;
- 15 (2) (B) The application of moxibustion; and
- 16 (3) (C) Manual, mechanical, thermal or electrical therapies only when performed in accordance with the principles of oriental acupuncture medical theories.
 - (2) The practice of acupuncture does not include the procedure of auricular acupuncture when used in the context of a chemical dependency treatment program when the person is trained

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is permit a person to perform auricular acupuncture when used in the context of a chemical dependency treatment program when the person is trained and approved by the National Acupuncture Detoxification Association.
