Introduced SB 312 2017R2290

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §18-5-18f, relating to establishing a four-year pilot program to have social workers in public schools from prekindergarten through elementary school; requiring a minimum of one social worker per county; defining a term; requiring guidelines and criteria relating to the pilot programs be prescribed; and requiring annual and final reports.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

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That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §18-5-18f, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 5. COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION.

§18-5-18f. Social worker pilot programs; reports.

- (a) County boards shall, by July 1, 2017, establish four-year social worker pilot programs
 for all children in prekindergarten though elementary school.
- 3 (b) For purposes of this section, "social worker" means a nonteaching school employee
 4 who, at a minimum:
- 5 (1) Possesses a license in social work with the West Virginia Board of Social Work:
- 6 (2) Has a minimum of five years' experience working with children and families; and
- 7 (3) Has experience conducting home visits, providing parent education, crisis intervention 8 and advocacy and support services, with school based social work experience being preferred.
- 9 (c) Abuse and neglect, poor nutrition and health care, behavior problems, homelessness,
 10 poor academic performance, lack of parent evolvement and substance abuse are areas of
 11 concern facing public education. Teachers and support staff are called upon to address these
 12 issues to the detriment of their educational responsibilities. Having a trained social worker
- 14 (1) Permit problems to be addressed by professionals trained to deal with those issues 15 and guide teachers and staff on child protective laws;

available to students, staff and parents is beneficial in the following ways:

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16 (2) Unburden teachers and support staff so they can focus on performing their educational 17 responsibilities to the students; 18 (3) The social worker's role will be to work with the guidance counselor with a team 19 approach. The social worker would not only work with the child at the school but conduct home 20 visits as necessary to address parent issues, provide parenting education, address social and 21 emotional issues, address physical and mental health issues and advocate for the family linking 22 them to necessary community resources; and 23 (4) Assist in ensuring an atmosphere in the classroom where learning can be achieved to 24 ensure the child's success in school and life. 25 (d) Pilot programs implemented by the county boards shall provide for a minimum of one 26 social worker for one Title 1, prekindergarten through elementary school, in each county. If more 27 than one Title 1 elementary school exists in the county that qualifies, the Title 1 school with the 28 lowest test scores should be given preference. This will ensure the social worker is placed in a 29 high poverty school where students are most in need. Addressing issues of concern in a child's 30 early educational experience can prevent future problems from occurring. 31 (e) The state board with the advice of the state superintendent shall establish and 32 prescribe guidelines and criteria relating to the establishment and operation of the social worker 33 pilot programs. 34 (f) Each county board shall submit an annual report on the effectiveness of the social 35 worker pilot programs to the state board no later than June 15, of each year, beginning in 2018. 36 The state board shall compile these individual reports and submit its own annual report to the 37 Legislative Oversight Commission on Education Accountability before September 1, of each year, 38 beginning in 2018. 39 (g) The state board shall submit a final report on the social worker pilot program, including 40 findings, conclusions and recommendations, together with drafts of any legislation or rule changes 41 necessary to effectuate the recommendations, to the Legislative Oversight Commission on Introduced SB 312 2017R2290

42 Education Accountability no later than September 1, 2021.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish a four-year pilot program to have social workers in public schools, from prekindergarten through the elementary school. The bill requires a minimum of one social worker per county. The bill requires guidelines and criteria relating to the pilot programs be prescribed. The bill defines "social worker." The bill requires annual and final reports.
