- 1 A BILL to amend and reenact §29-22B-501 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
- 2 relating to the limited video lottery; and permitting limited video lottery retailers with more
- 3 than one location to sell one or more of their operations to another person.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

- 1 That §29-22B-501 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and
- 2 reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 22B. LIMITED VIDEO LOTTERY.

PART 5. REQUIREMENTS AND QUALIFICATIONS FOR LICENSURE.

§29-22B-501. Types of licenses issued for participation in limited video lottery activities.

(a) The Lottery Commission may issue four types of limited video lottery licenses, as
 follows:

- 3 (1) A manufacturer's license;
- 4 (2) An operator's license;
- 5 (3) A limited video lottery retailer's license; and
- 6 (4) A service technician's license.

7 (b) A manufacturer's license is required for all persons who act as a manufacturer as
8 defined in section 22B-319 of this article.

9 (c) An operator's license is required for all persons who engage in the business of placing 10 and operating video gaming machines on the premises of a retailer. A licensed operator and a 11 licensed limited video lottery retailer who hold a permit issued under part 11 of this article may 12 obtain video lottery terminals only from a licensed manufacturer.

(d) A video lottery retailer's license is required for all persons conducting limited video
lottery on their premises. Each person licensed as a retailer shall have and maintain sole and
exclusive legal possession of the entire premises for which the retail license is issued: *Provided*,
<u>That effective with the passage of this amendment, a limited video lottery retailer who has more</u>

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- 17 than one location may sell or transfer one or more of its operations and premises locations,
- 18 including the limited video lottery retailer's license for these operations and premises locations, to
- 19 another person if that other person otherwise meets the regulatory provisions of this article for a
- 20 limited video lottery retailer's license and the commission is notified of the intended change of
- 21 ownership for that operation.
- 22 (e) Each license issued pursuant to this section expires one year from the date of its
- 23 issuance but may be successively renewed upon the filing and approval of an application for
- 24 renewal, except as otherwise provided in this article.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit limited video lottery retailers with more than one location to sell one or more of their operations to another person.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
