A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §18B-1B-14, relating generally to creating direct affiliation between state
universities and research, development and technology parks within the state; transferring
ownership of the West Virginia Regional Technology Park to Marshall University;
establishing requirement for private investment and funding; and directing the Higher
Education Policy Commission to research and report to the Legislature.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
section, designated §18B-1B-14, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 1B. HIGHER EDUCATION POLICY COMMISSION.

§18B-1B-14. Research, development and technology parks; transfer of property; funding requirement; commission to study and report additional acquisition.

(a) (1) Commencing with the effective date of this section, the Higher Education Policy 1 2 Commission shall undertake all measures necessary to, and shall complete, transfer of ownership 3 of the West Virginia Regional Technology Park in South Charleston, West Virginia, to the 4 governing board of Marshall University by July 1, 2018. 5 (2) The governing board of the university shall thereafter manage development and 6 participation in the Regional Technology Park in a manner whereby fifty percent or more of the 7 investment and funding for the operation, administration and additional development of the facility 8 shall originate from private sources. 9 (b) The Higher Education Policy Commission shall research and investigate the potential 10 for acquiring an interest in the I-79 Technology Park on behalf of West Virginia University for 11 development and management that would result in either inclusion within the WVU Center for 12 Economic Development and Technology Advancement, a separate public-private partnership, or 13 other form of development and technology institution directly affiliated with the university. The 14 commission shall submit a report of its investigation and findings to the Legislature on or before

15 <u>December 31, 2017.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide for direct affiliation of technology and development parks with the state's universities.
