

1 AN ACT to amend and reenact the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §5A-3-3a, relating to facilities providing direct patient care 2 services that are managed, directed, controlled and governed by the Secretary of the 3 4 Department of Health and Human Resources; exempting such facilities from statewide 5 purchasing requirements and from the otherwise required oversight and review by the 6 Purchasing Division of the Department of Administration; and requiring the Legislative 7 Auditor to audit purchasing made by facilities and report the findings to the Joint 8 Committee on Government and Finance.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
section, designated §5A-3-3a, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 3. PURCHASING DIVISION.

§5A-3-3a. Exemption of facilities providing direct patient care services that are managed, directed, controlled and governed by the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Resources.

1 Notwithstanding any provisions of section one or three of this article to the contrary, the 2 provisions of this article do not apply to facilities providing direct patient care services that are managed, directed, controlled and governed by the Secretary of the Department of Health and 3 Human Resources: Provided, That on or before July 1, 2020, the Legislative Auditor shall audit 4 the purchasing procedures of the facilities described in this section and report the results to the 5 Joint Committee on Government and Finance on the effects of exempting said facilities from the 6 provisions of this article, including, but not limited to, any realized cost savings and changes in 7 8 purchasing policies resulting from such exemption.
