- 1 A BILL to amend and reenact §30-5-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating
- to permitting pharmacists to inform customers about lower cost alternatives to prescribed
 drugs.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 5. PHARMACISTS, PHARMACY TECHNICIANS, PHARMACY INTERNS,

AND PHARMACIES.

§30-5-10. Scope practice for licensed pharmacist;

- 1 (a) A licensed pharmacist may:
- 2 (1) Provide care related to the interpretation, evaluation, and implementation of medical
- 3 orders;
- 4 (2) Dispense prescription drug orders; participate in drug and device selection;
- 5 (3) Provide drug administration;
- 6 (4) Provide drug regimen review;
- 7 (5) Provide drug or drug-related research;
- 8 (6) Perform patient counseling;
- 9 (7) Provide pharmacy-related primary care;
- 10 (8) Provide pharmacist care in all areas of patient care, including collaborative pharmacy
- 11 practice;
- 12 (9) Compound and label drugs and drug devices;
- 13 (10) Proper and safe storage of drugs and devices;
- 14 (11) Maintain proper records;
- 15 (12) Provide patient counseling concerning the therapeutic value and proper use of drugs
- 16 and devices;
- 17 (13) Order laboratory tests in accordance with drug therapy management; and
- 18 (14) Provide medication therapy management; and

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- 19 (15) Inform customers about lower cost alternatives to the medication that the customers
- 20 have been prescribed, including, but not limited to, biosimilar or generic drugs.
- (b) A licensee meeting the requirements as promulgated by legislative rule may administerimmunizations.
- (c) The sale of any medicine, if the contents of its container, or any part thereof, taken at
 one time, are likely to prove poisonous, deleterious, or habit-forming is prohibited by any person
 other than a registered pharmacist, who shall take precautions to acquaint the purchaser of the
 nature of the medicine at the time of sale.
