INTRODUCED H.B.

- A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
  designated §11-16-30; and to amend said code by adding thereto a new section,
  designated §60-4-24, all relating to exempting commercial airlines from obtaining licenses
- 4 to serve liquor, beer or wine on flights.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

- 1 That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
- 2 section, designated §11-16-30; and that said code be amended by adding thereto a new section,
- 3 designated §60-4-24, all to read as follows:

### CHAPTER 11. TAXATION.

#### ARTICLE 16. NONINTOXICATING BEER.

#### §11-16-30. Exemption for Commercial Airlines.

- 1 Any commercial airline, as defined by 14 CFR Parts 121 and 135, and by section two,
- 2 article six-h, chapter eleven of this code, that operates in the state is exempt from the licensing
- 3 requirements of this chapter.

### CHAPTER 60. STATE CONTROL OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS.

#### ARTICLE 4. LICENSES.

#### §60-4-24. Exemption for Commercial Airlines.

- 1 Any commercial airline, as defined by 14 CFR Parts 121 and 135, and by section two,
- 2 article six-h, chapter eleven of this code, that operates in the state is exempt from the licensing
- 3 requirements of this chapter.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to exempt commercial airlines from the licensing requirements of the state to serve liquor, beer or wine on flights.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
