1 A BILL to amend and reenact §18-9A-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to
 2 amend and reenact §18-9A-8 of said code, all relating to increasing the basic foundation
 3 allowance to the county for professional student support personnel.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 9A. PUBLIC SCHOOL SUPPORT.

§18-9A-2. Definitions.

1 For the purpose of this article:

2 ~~(a) "State board" means the West Virginia Board of Education~~

3 ~~(b) "County board" or "board" means a county board of education.~~

4 ~~(c) "Professional salaries" means the state legally mandated salaries of the professional~~
 5 ~~educators as provided in article four, chapter eighteen-a of this code~~

6 "High-density county" means a county whose ratio of net enrollment, excluding any
 7 increase in the net enrollment of counties, pursuant to subdivision (5), subsection (i) of this
 8 section, of the definition of "net enrollment", to the square miles of the county is equal to or greater
 9 than twenty.

10 "Levies for general current expense purposes" means ninety percent of the levy rate for
 11 county boards of education calculated or set by the Legislature pursuant to §11-8-6f of this code.

12 "Low-density county" means a county whose ratio of net enrollment, excluding any
 13 increase in the net enrollment of counties, pursuant to subdivision (5), subsection (i) of this
 14 section, of the definition of "net enrollment", to the square miles of the county is equal to or greater
 15 than five but less than ten.

16 "Medium-density county" means a county whose ratio of net enrollment, excluding any
 17 increase in the net enrollment of counties, pursuant to subdivision (5), subsection (i) of this
 18 section, of the definition of "net enrollment", to the square miles of the county is equal to or greater
 19 than ten but less than twenty.

20 "Net enrollment" means the number of pupils enrolled in special education programs.

21 kindergarten programs and grades one to twelve, inclusive, of the public schools of the county.

22 Net enrollment further shall include:

23 (1) Adults enrolled in regular secondary vocational programs existing as of the effective
24 date of this section, subject to the following:

25 (A) Net enrollment includes no more than 1,000 of those adults counted on the basis of
26 full-time equivalency and apportioned annually to each county in proportion to the adults
27 participating in regular secondary vocational programs in the prior year counted on the basis of
28 full-time equivalency; and

29 (B) Net enrollment does not include any adult charged tuition or special fees beyond that
30 required of the regular secondary vocational student;

31 (2) Students enrolled in early childhood education programs as provided in section forty-
32 four, article five of this chapter, counted on the basis of full-time equivalency;

33 (3) No pupil shall be counted more than once by reason of transfer within the county or
34 from another county within the state, and no pupil shall be counted who attends school in this
35 state from another state;

36 (4) The enrollment shall be modified to the equivalent of the instructional term and in
37 accordance with the eligibility requirements and rules established by the state board; and

38 (5) For the purposes of determining the county's basic foundation program only, for any
39 county whose net enrollment as determined under all other provisions of this definition is less than
40 1,400, the net enrollment of the county shall be increased by an amount to be determined in
41 accordance with the following:

42 (A) Divide the state's lowest county student population density by the county's actual
43 student population density;

44 (B) Multiply the amount derived from the calculation in paragraph (A) of this subdivision
45 by the difference between 1,400 and the county's actual net enrollment;

46 (C) If the increase in net enrollment as determined under this subdivision plus the county's

47 net enrollment as determined under all other provisions of this subsection is greater than 1,400,
 48 the increase in net enrollment shall be reduced so that the total does not exceed 1,400; and

49 (D) During the 2008-2009 interim period and every three interim periods thereafter, the
 50 Legislative Oversight Commission on Education Accountability shall review this subdivision to
 51 determine whether or not these provisions properly address the needs of counties with low
 52 enrollment and a sparse population density.

53 ~~(d)~~ "Professional educator" shall be synonymous with and shall have the same meaning
 54 as "teacher" as defined in §18-1-1 of this code, and includes technology integration specialists.

55 (e) "Professional instructional personnel" means a professional educator whose regular
 56 duty is as that of a classroom teacher, librarian, attendance director or school psychologist. A
 57 professional educator having both instructional and administrative or other duties shall be
 58 included as professional instructional personnel for that ratio of the school day for which he or she
 59 is assigned and serves on a regular full-time basis in appropriate instruction, library, attendance
 60 or psychologist duties.

61 "Professional salaries" means the state legally mandated salaries of the professional
 62 educators as provided in §18A-4-1 et seq. of this code.

63 (f) "Professional student support personnel" means a "teacher" as defined in §18-1-1 of
 64 this code who is assigned and serves on a regular full-time basis as a counselor or as a school
 65 nurse with a bachelor's degree and who is licensed by the West Virginia Board of Examiners for
 66 Registered Professional Nurses. Professional student support personnel shall also include
 67 professional personnel providing direct social and emotional support services to students,
 68 including, but not limited to, social workers and psychologists. For all purposes except for the
 69 determination of the allowance for professional educators pursuant to §18-9A-4 of this code,
 70 professional student support personnel are professional educators.

71 ~~(g) "Service personnel salaries" means the state legally mandated salaries for service~~
 72 ~~personnel as provided in section eight-a, article four, chapter eighteen-a of this code~~

73 ~~(h)~~ "Service personnel" means all personnel as provided in §18A-4-8 of this code. For the
 74 purpose of computations under this article of ratios of service personnel to net enrollment, a
 75 service employee shall be counted as that number found by dividing his or her number of
 76 employment days in a fiscal year by 200: *Provided*, That the computation for any service person
 77 employed for three and one-half hours or less per day as provided in section eight-a, article four,
 78 chapter eighteen-a of this code shall be calculated as one half an employment day.

79 "Service personnel salaries" means the state legally mandated salaries for service
 80 personnel as provided in §18A-4-8a of this code.

118 "State board" means the West Virginia Board of Education.

119 "State aid eligible personnel" means all professional educators and service personnel
 120 employed by a county board in positions that are eligible to be funded under this article and whose
 121 salaries are not funded by a specific funding source such as a federal or state grant, donation,
 122 contribution or other specific funding source not listed.

 142 ~~employed by a county board in positions that are eligible to be funded under this article and whose~~
 143 ~~salaries are not funded by a specific funding source such as a federal or state grant, donation,~~
 144 ~~contribution or other specific funding source not listed~~

§18-9A-8. Foundation allowance for professional student support services.

1 (a) The basic foundation allowance to the county for professional student support
 2 personnel shall be the amount of money determined in accordance with the following:

3 (1) The sum of the state minimum salaries, as determined in accordance with the
 4 provisions of §18-4-1 *et seq* of this code, for all state aid eligible school nurse and counselor
 5 positions in the county during the 2008 fiscal year which number shall be reduced in the same

6 proportion as the number of professional educators allowed to be funded under §18-9A-4 of this
7 code to the total number of professional educators employed that are state aid eligible. In
8 performing this calculation, the numerator shall be the number of professional educators actually
9 funded under §18-9A-4 of this code and the denominator shall be the total number of professional
10 educators employed that are eligible to be funded under §18-9A-4 of this code;

11 (2) The amount derived from the calculation in §18-9A-8(a)(1) of this code is increased by
12 one half percent;

13 (3) The amount derived from the calculation in §18-9A-8(a)(2) of this code is the basic
14 foundation allowance to the county for professional student support personnel for the 2009 fiscal
15 year;

16 (4) For fiscal years 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013, the basic foundation allowance to the
17 county for professional student support personnel increases by one-half percent per year over
18 the allowance for the previous year; and

19 (5) For all fiscal years thereafter until fiscal year 2020, the basic foundation allowance to
20 the county for professional student support personnel remains the same amount as in the 2013
21 fiscal year, plus any additional amount of funding necessary to cover the increases in the State
22 Minimum Salary Schedule set forth in §18A-4-2 of this code effective for the fiscal year beginning
23 July 1, 2018, and thereafter.

24 (b) The additional positions for counselors that may be created as a result of the one
25 percent increase provided pursuant to this section shall be assigned to schools where the
26 counselor can:

27 (1) Enhance student achievement;

28 (2) Provide early intervention for students in grades prekindergarten through five; and

29 (3) Enhance student development and career readiness.

30 (c) Effective for the 2020 fiscal year and thereafter, the basic foundation allowance to the
31 county for professional student support personnel is the amount of money required to pay the

32 state minimum salaries, in accordance with provisions of §18A-4-1 et seq. of this code, subject to
33 the following:

34 (1) In making this computation, each county shall receive an allowance for five and
35 seventy-five hundredths state aid eligible professional student support personnel positions to
36 each 1,000 students in net enrollment:

37 (2) For any professional student support personnel positions, or fraction thereof,
38 determined for a county pursuant to §18-9A-8 of this code that exceed the number employed, the
39 county's allowance for these positions shall be determined using the average state funded salary
40 of professional student support personnel for the county:

41 (3) The number of and the allowance for all personnel paid in part by state and county
42 funds shall be prorated: and

43 (4) Where two or more counties join together in support of a vocational or comprehensive
44 high school or any other program or service, the professional student support personnel for the
45 school or program may be prorated among the participating counties on the basis of each one's
46 enrollment therein and the personnel shall be considered within the above-stated limit.

47 (5) For the 2020 fiscal year only, the number of positions funded for each county by
48 subdivision (1) cannot be less than the number of positions that would have been funded in
49 accordance with the previous methodology for determining the number of professional student
50 support personnel positions funded for each county.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to increase the basic foundation allowance to the county for professional student support personnel.
