A BILL to amend and reenact §61-6-21 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating
 to prohibiting violations of an individual's civil rights because of disability or sexual
 orientation; new definitions; and criminal penalty; and designating changes and section as
 "Angel's Law".

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 6. CRIMES AGAINST THE PEACE.

§61-6-21. Prohibiting violations of an individual's civil rights; penalties.

(a) All persons within the boundaries of the State of West Virginia have the right to be free
from any violence, or intimidation by threat of violence, committed against their persons or
property because of their race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, political affiliation, or sex
<u>disability or sexual orientation</u>. The term sexual orientation is defined as disclosed or perceived
male or female homosexuality, heterosexuality or bisexuality by practice or identification.

6 (b) If any person does by force or threat of force, willfully injure, intimidate or interfere with, 7 or attempt to injure, intimidate or interfere with, or oppress or threaten any other person in the 8 free exercise or enjoyment of any right or privilege secured to him or her by the Constitution or 9 laws of the State of West Virginia or by the Constitution or laws of the United States, because of 10 such other person's race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, political affiliation, or sex 11 disability or sexual orientation, he or she shall be is guilty of a felony and, upon conviction, shall 12 be fined not more than \$5,000 or imprisoned in a state correctional facility not more than 10 years. 13 or both fined and imprisoned. If any person conspires with another person or persons to willfully 14 injure, oppress, threaten, or intimidate or interfere with any citizen because of such other person's 15 race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, political affiliation, or sex disability or sexual 16 orientation in the free exercise or enjoyment of any right or privilege secured to him or her by the 17 Constitution or laws of the State of West Virginia or by the Constitution or laws of the United 18 States, and in willful furtherance thereof to assemble with one or more persons for the purpose of 19 teaching any technique or means capable of causing property damage, bodily injury or death

20 when such person or persons intend to employ such techniques or means to violate this section, 21 each such person shall be guilty of a felony and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than 22 \$5,000 or imprisoned in a state correctional facility not more than 10 years, or both fined and 23 imprisoned. 24 (d) The fact that a person committed a felony or misdemeanor, or attempted to commit a 25 felony, because of the victim's race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, political affiliation or sex disability or sexual orientation, shall be considered a circumstance in aggravation of any crime 26 27 in imposing sentence. 28 (e) Nothing contained in this section makes unlawful the teaching of any technique in self-29 defense. 30 (f) Nothing in this section shall may be construed so as to make it unlawful nor to prohibit. 31 nor, in any manner, to impede or to interfere in any manner with any person in conducting labor 32 union or labor union organizing activities 33 (g) The amendments to this section shall be known as "Angel's Law".

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit violations of an individual's civil rights because of disability or sexual orientation. New definitions are added, and changes are to be known as "Angel's Law".

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
