1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,

designated §61-17-1, relating to abolishing mandatory prison sentences.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

#### **ARTICLE 17. ABOLISHMENT OF MANDATORY PRISON SENTENCING.**

#### §61-17-1. Abolishment of mandatory prison sentences.

- 1 <u>Notwithstanding any provision in this code to the contrary, mandatory or prescribed prison</u>
- 2 <u>sentencing and sentences are hereby abolished. Any mandatory or prescribed sentences referred</u>
- 3 to in this code shall be hereinafter be read as being the maximum sentence allowed by law and
- 4 the courts.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to abolish mandatory prison sentences.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
