1 A BILL to amend and reenact §64-9-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating
2 to authorizing the Massage Therapy Licensure Board to promulgate a legislative rule
3 relating to consideration of prior criminal convictions in initial licensure determinations.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

**ARTICLE 9. AUTHORIZATION FOR MISCELLANEOUS AGENCIES AND BOARDS
TO PROMULGATE LEGISLATIVE RULES.**

§64-9-1. Massage Therapy Licensure Board.

1 The legislative rule filed in the State Register on September 24, 2019, authorized under
2 the authority of §30-1-24 of this code, modified by the Massage Therapy Licensure Board to meet
3 the objections of the Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee and refiled in the State Register
4 on November 7, 2019, relating to the Massage Therapy Licensure Board (consideration of prior
5 criminal convictions in initial licensure determinations, [194 CSR 06](#)), is authorized.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Massage Therapy Licensure Board to promulgate a legislative rule relating to consideration of prior criminal convictions in initial licensure determinations.

This section is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
