A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
designated §5B-9-1, §5B-9-2 and §5B-9-3, all relating to establishment of an Economic
and Community Development Task Force; composition of task force; and requiring a
report of task force to Joint Committee on Government and Finance.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 8. ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT_TASK FORCE.

§5B-9-1. Establishment of task force.

- 1 An Economic and Community Development Task Force is hereby established. The task force shall study and encourage pilot programs for targeted community improvement and 2 3 enrichment, using all available community and government resources for creative and effective 4 activities. Community problems would be targeted for consolidated actions by community and 5 religious groups and through government, education and social service agencies, both state and 6 local. Individuals assigned to any pilot projects would be located together in the community away 7 from separated agency offices and programs that have failed to address the special targeted 8 problems of our communities. The task force shall cease when its responsibilities as set out in 9 this article are completed. §5B-9-2. Composition of task force. 1 (a) The task force consists of the following members, or their respective designees. 2 (1) The President of the Senate; 3 (2) The Speaker of the House of Delegates; 4 (3) The Executive Director of the West Virginia Economic Development Authority; 5 (4) A representative of the Regional Planning and Development Authority (or Authorities); 6 (5) A representative of the Workforce West Virginia Career Center (or Centers); 7 (6) Two representatives of a local Economic Development Agency. 8 (7) Two county commissioners; and
- 9 (8) Two city or town council members.

- 10 (b) No more than three task force members who are representatives of local economic
- 11 development agencies, county commissions or council members may be from the same
- 12 congressional district.

§5B-9-3. Task force report.

- 1 (a) The task force shall create a report within one year of its establishment.
- 2 (b) The task force report shall be delivered within the one-year time frame to the Joint
- 3 Committee on Government and Finance, and shall simultaneously be made public by a paper
- 4 copy and the Internet.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish an Economic and Community Development Task Force. The bill sets forth the composition of task force and requires a report to the Joint Committee on Government and Finance.
