1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article, 2 designated §7-4A-1, §7-4A-2, §7-4A-3, §7-4A-4, §7-4A-5, §7-4A-6, and §7-4A-7, all 3 relating to creating the Prosecuting Attorney's Detectives Act; providing a short title; 4 making legislative findings; providing for law-enforcement titles; setting forth the duties 5 and powers of prosecuting attorney's detectives; providing for compensation of 6 prosecuting attorney's detectives; permitting prosecuting attorneys to hire detectives; 7 establishing arrest power of prosecuting attorney's detectives; and setting forth 8 requirements for appointment as a prosecuting attorney's detective.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

## ARTICLE 4A. THE PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S DETECTIVES ACT.

#### §7-4A-1. Short title.

1 This article shall be known and may be cited as the Prosecuting Attorney's Detectives Act.

#### §7-4A-2. Legislative findings.

- 1 <u>The Legislature finds and declares that:</u>
- 2 (a) In West Virginia's criminal justice system, prosecuting attorney's office investigators

3 and the law-enforcement officers assigned to prosecuting attorney's office perform vital and highly

- 4 sensitive duties.
- 5 (b) It is critical to the confidence of the public in West Virginia's criminal justice system that
- 6 the integrity and impartiality of prosecuting attorney's detectives and their investigations be a high
- 7 priority at all times.
- 8 (c) It is the purpose of this article to establish statewide standards and a code of conduct
- 9 and professionalism for prosecuting attorney's detectives and the law-enforcement officers
- 10 <u>assigned to the prosecuting attorney's office.</u>

### §7-4A-3. Law-enforcement titles.

1 The provisions of this article include all law-enforcement titles in the office of the

2 prosecuting attorney.

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#### §7-4A-4. Duties and powers of detectives.

- 1 (a) The prosecuting attorney's detectives of each of the prosecuting attorney's offices, in
- 2 addition to any and all powers prescribed by law, have the power to enforce:
- 3 (1) All rules and regulations promulgated by the governing body of the county governing
- 4 the use by the public of county highways and roads; and
- 5 (2) All rules and regulations promulgated by the governing body of the county respecting
- 6 the general health, safety, and welfare of the public within the county.
- 7 (b) Prosecuting attorney's detectives shall be certified law-enforcement officers and have
- 8 <u>full power of arrest consistent with that of a deputy sheriff.</u>

## §7-4A-5. Employment status compensation.

- 1 (a) A full-time prosecuting attorney's detective shall be compensated at a rate mutually
- 2 agreed upon by the prosecuting attorney and the prosecuting attorney's detective.
- 3 (b) A full-time prosecuting attorney's detective shall be afforded employee benefits that
- 4 are available to full-time county employees of the county in which the prosecuting attorney's
- 5 <u>detective is employed.</u>

# §7-4A-6. Appointment of detectives.

- 1 The prosecuting attorney may appoint a sufficient number of suitable persons, to be known
- 2 as prosecuting attorney's detectives, for the purpose of assisting the prosecuting attorney in the
- 3 <u>detection, apprehension, arrest, and conviction of offenders against the law.</u>

# §7-4A-7. Requirements.

- Except as otherwise provided by law, a person may not be appointed to the title of prosecuting attorney's detective unless that person is of good moral turpitude and is a certified law-enforcement officer with at least five years of experience in a municipal, county, state, or
- 4 <u>federal law-enforcement agency.</u>
