Senate Bill 303

1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
2 designated §18-10P-1, §18-10P-2, §18-10P-3, §18-10P-4, §18-10P-5, and §18-10P-6, all
3 relating to enacting the Students' Right-to-Know Act; providing purpose of making high
4 school students aware of the cost of four-year colleges and other alternative career paths;
5 requiring the State Board of Education to collect and disseminate certain career landscape
6 information; and establishing an effective date.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 10P. STUDENTS' RIGHT-TO-KNOW ACT.

§18-10P-1. Short title.

1 This article shall be known and may be cited as the "Students' Right-to-Know Act."

§18-10P-2. Purpose.

1 The purpose of this article is to help high school students make more informed decisions
2 about their futures and ensure that they are adequately aware of the cost of four-year college and
3 other, alternative career paths.

§18-10P-3. Career landscape information collection.

1 The following information shall be collected and compiled by the State Board of Education
2 on an annual basis:

3 (1) The most in-demand jobs in the state, including starting salary and education level
4 required for those jobs;

5 (2) The average cost for all major colleges and vocational schools in the state;
6 (3) The average monthly student loan payment for individuals who attend all major
7 colleges and vocational schools in the state;

8 (4) The average three-year student loan default rate for all major colleges and vocational
9 schools in the state;

10 (5) The average graduation rate for all major colleges and vocational schools in the state;
11 (6) The completion rates for apprenticeship programs, high school credential programs,

12 career and technical education programs, and military first-term enlistments.

13 (7) The share of college graduates working in an occupation that does not require a college
14 degree for each major;

15 (8) The average starting salary for individuals graduating from a major college; and

16 (9) The average starting salary for individuals graduating from a vocational school in the
17 state.

§18-10P-4. Information distribution.

1 The information collected by the State Board of Education in §18-10P-3 of this code shall
2 be distributed to every public high school in the state for public distribution to students by school
3 guidance counselors no later than October 15 of each year.

§18-10P-5. Data sharing.

1 The State Board of Education may execute a memorandum of understanding with any
2 department, agency, or division for information required to be collected by this article.

§18-10P-6. Effective date.

1 The requirements of this article are effective on January 1, 2021.
