## **Senate Bill 430**

1 A BILL to amend and reenact §64-9-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating  
2 to authorizing the Board of Psychologists to promulgate a legislative rule relating to  
3 consideration of prior criminal convictions in initial licensure determinations and  
4 application for waiver of initial licensing fees for certain individuals.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

**ARTICLE 9. AUTHORIZATION FOR MISCELLANEOUS AGENCIES AND BOARDS  
TO PROMULGATE LEGISLATIVE RULES.**

**§64-9-1. Board of Psychologists.**

1 The legislative rule filed in the State Register on October 11, 2019, authorized under the  
2 authority of §30-1-24 of this code, modified by the Board of Psychologists to meet the objections  
3 of the Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee and refiled in the State Register on January 8,  
4 2020, relating to the Board of Psychologists (consideration of prior criminal convictions in initial  
5 licensure determinations and application for waiver of initial licensing fees for certain individuals,  
6 [17 CSR 07](#)), is authorized.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Board of Psychologists to promulgate a legislative rule relating to consideration of prior criminal convictions in initial licensure determinations and application for waiver of initial licensing fees for certain individuals.
