- 1 A BILL to amend and reenact §25-5-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating
- 2 to prohibiting the private ownership or operation of a prison in West Virginia.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 5. PRIVATE PRISONS.

§25-5-5. Prohibition of constructing or operating a correctional facility; exceptions.

- 1 (a) No person may operate a private prison facility or provide correctional services in this
- 2 state without first obtaining the written approval of the secretary.
- 3 (b) No person may construct, modify, lease, or otherwise alter a private prison facility
- 4 without first obtaining the written approval of the Regional Jail Authority.
- 5 (c) Nothing in this section shall impair the right of the state or its political subdivisions to
- 6 operate a prison facility or provide correctional services.
- 7 (d) No private contractor may operate a correctional facility in this state for the confinement
- 8 of maximum security inmates sentenced to a term of incarceration by a foreign court.
- 9 (e) Effective July 1, 2019, no person may own or operate a private prison facility in this
- 10 <u>state.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit the private ownership or operation of prison facilities in West Virginia.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
