- 1 A BILL to amend and reenact §17C-14-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating
- 2 to clarifying that a vehicle may not be backed into a public street or highway unless it does
- 3 not interfere with other traffic.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 14. MISCELLANEOUS RULES.

§17C-14-2. Limitations on backing; penalty.

- 1 (a) The driver of a vehicle <u>upon a public street</u>, road or highway or of a vehicle entering a
- 2 <u>public street, road, or highway</u> shall not back the same vehicle unless such the movement can be
- 3 made with reasonable safety and without interfering with other traffic.
- 4 (b) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon
- 5 conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100; upon a second conviction within one year
- 6 thereafter, shall be fined not more than \$200; and upon a third or subsequent conviction, shall be
- 7 fined not more than \$500.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to clarify that a vehicle may not be backed into a public street or highway unless it does not interfere with other traffic.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
