# House Bill 2647

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
designated §16-63-1, §16-63-2, §16-63-3, §16-63-4, §16-63-5, §16-63-6, §16-63-7, and
§16-63-8, all relating to generally to prohibiting the use of polystyrene containers;
definitions; and authorizing the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources
to impose civil fines for violations.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

#### ARTICLE 63. PROHIBITING ONE-USE POLYSTYRENE CONTAINERS.

#### §16-63-1. Legislative purpose and intent.

- 1 The purpose and intent of this article is to reduce the adverse environmental impact of
- 2 polystyrene food containers by prohibiting a food establishment from dispensing prepared food to
- 3 <u>a customer in a one-use polystyrene food service container.</u>

#### §16-63-2. Definitions.

- 1 The following words and phrases when used in this article have the meanings given to
- 2 them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 3 <u>"Department" means the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources.</u>
- 4 <u>"Director" means the Director of Health.</u>
- 5 <u>"Food establishment" means all sales outlets, stores, shops or other places of business</u>
- 6 located within this state which operate primarily to sell or convey food directly to the ultimate
- 7 consumer, which food is predominately contained, wrapped or held in or on packaging. The term
- 8 includes, but is not limited to, any place where food is prepared, mixed, cooked, baked, smoked,
- 9 preserved, bottled, packaged, handled, stored, manufactured and sold or offered for sale,
- 10 including, but not limited to, any fixed or mobile restaurant, drive-in, coffee shop, cafeteria, short-
- 11 order cafe, delicatessen, luncheonette, grill, sandwich shop, soda fountain, tavern, bar, cocktail
- 12 lounge, nightclub, roadside stand, prepared food takeout place, industrial feeding establishment,
- 13 catering kitchen, commissary, grocery store, public food market, food stand or similar place in
- 14 which food or drink is prepared for sale or for service on the premises or elsewhere, and any other

- 15 establishment or operation, including homes, where food is processed, prepared, stored, served
- 16 <u>or provided for the public.</u>
- 17 <u>"Polystyrene food service container" means as follows:</u>
- 18 (1) A single-use polystyrene foam food service container such as a cup, bowl, plate, and
- 19 clamshell-style container in addition to a foam cooler that is not encased in another material.
- 20 (2) A single-use polystyrene solid plastic food container such as a cup, bowl, plate,
- 21 clamshell-style container, cutlery, straw and cup lid.
- 22 <u>"Prepared food" means food or beverage prepared for public consumption by a food</u>
- 23 establishment using any cooking or food preparation technique. The term does not include raw
- 24 or uncooked meat, fish, or eggs provided for public consumption without further food preparation
- 25 <u>"Retailer" means a person that purchases or receives products from any source for the</u>
- 26 purpose of sale to a consumer.

#### §16-63-3. Prohibitions; food establishment; retailer.

- 1 (a) Food establishment. A food establishment is prohibited from the following:
- 2 (1) Dispensing prepared food in or on a polystyrene food service container.
- 3 (2) Selling, giving or providing eating utensils or straws composed of polystyrene.
- 4 (b) Retailer. A retailer is prohibited from selling, giving or providing a polystyrene food
- 5 service container except for the following:
- 6 <u>(1) Meat trays.</u>
- 7 <u>(2) Eqg cartons.</u>
- 8 (3) Packing materials.
  - §16-63-4. Compliance.
- 1 The department shall develop and maintain a publicly accessible Internet website with all
- 2 the following:
- 3 (1) A description of the information necessary to comply with the prohibition under §16-
- 4 <u>63-3 of this code.</u>

- 5 (2) A description of the procedure to file a complaint with the department for a violation of
- 6 the prohibitions under §16-63-3 of this code.

#### §16-63-5. Rules.

- 1 The director shall propose rules for legislative approval in accordance with §29A-3-1 et
- 2 seq. of this code necessary to implement the provisions of this article.

### §16-63-6. Penalties.

- 1 (a) Imposition. The director may impose a civil penalty in the following amounts for a
- 2 <u>violation of this article:</u>
- 3 (1) For a first violation, \$500.
- 4 (2) For a second violation, \$1,000.
- 5 (3) For a third or subsequent violation, \$2,000.
- 6 (b) Payment. Any civil penalty collected under subsection (a) shall be paid to the
- 7 <u>department.</u>

## §16-63-7. Local law.

- 1 This article preempts any ordinance or resolution passed or adopted by any political
- 2 subdivision that is effective as of the date of this article to the extent that the ordinance or
- 3 resolution conflicts or is inconsistent with the provisions of this article.

## §16-63-8. Applicability.

1 This article shall apply to transactions consummated on or after July 1, 2021.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit the use of polystyrene containers.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
