1	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
2	designated §5-30-1, §5-30-2, §5-30-3, and §5-30-4, all relating to ensuring protections for
3	religious freedom in the State of West Virginia; providing generally a means by which to
4	respect religious and political speech; creating conscientious protections for the preventive
5	care mandate; and creating religious liberty guidance.
	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

## ARTICLE 30. PROMOTING FREE SPEECH AND RELIGIOUS LIBERTY ACT.

#### §5-30-1. Policy.

1 It shall be the policy of the State of West Virginia to ensure a robust protection for religious 2 freedom. The Founders of our Country envisioned a nation in which religious voices and views 3 were integral to a vibrant public square, and in which religious people and institutions were free 4 to practice their faith without fear of discrimination or retaliation by the Federal Government or the 5 Government of the State of West Virginia. For that reason, the United States Constitution and the 6 West Virginia Constitution enshrines and protects the fundamental right to religious liberty as 7 Americans' first freedom. Federal and state law protects the freedom of Americans and their 8 organizations to exercise religion and participate fully in civic life without undue interference by 9 the Federal or State Government. §5-30-2. Respecting religious and political speech.

1 All departments and agencies in West Virginia shall, to the greatest extent practicable and 2 to the extent permitted by law, respect and protect the freedom of persons and organizations to 3 engage in religious and political speech. In particular, the State of West Virginia shall ensure, to 4 the extent permitted by law, that the state does not take any adverse action against any individual, 5 house of worship, or other religious organization on the basis that such individual or organization 6 speaks or has spoken about moral or political issues from a religious perspective, where speech 7 of similar character has, consistent with law, not ordinarily been treated as participation or 8 intervention in a political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) a candidate for public office

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- 9 by the state. As used in this section, the term "adverse action" means the imposition of any tax or
- 10 tax penalty; the delay or denial of tax-exempt status; the disallowance of tax deductions for
- 11 contributions made to entities exempted from taxation under section 501(c)(3) of title 26, United
- 12 States Code; or any other action that makes unavailable or denies any tax deduction, exemption,
- 13 <u>credit, or benefit.</u>

#### §5-30-3. Conscience protections with respect to preventive-care mandate.

- 1 The secretary of all agencies in West Virginia shall consider issuing amended regulations,
- 2 consistent with applicable law, to address conscience-based objections to the preventive-care
- 3 mandate promulgated under section 300gg–13(a)(4) of title 42, United States Code.

#### §5-30-4. Religious liberty guidance.

- 1 In order to guide all agencies in complying with relevant federal and state law, the West
- 2 <u>Virginia Attorney General shall, as appropriate, issue guidance interpreting religious liberty</u>
- 3 protections in federal and state law.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to ensure protection for religious freedom and religious speech in West Virginia.
