## House Bill 3293

[Originating in the Committee on Education, reported

on March 16, 2021]

1 A BILL to amend and reenact §18-2-5c and §18-2-25 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as 2 amended, all relating to single-sex participation in interscholastic athletic events; providing 3 county school districts must confirm the sex of pupil at time of birth prior to pupil's 4 participation in single-sex interscholastic athletic events under the control, supervision, 5 and regulation of the West Virginia Secondary Schools Activities Commission; providing 6 sex at birth be identified by original birth certificate or by a signed physician's statement; 7 providing that the commission must verify with each county board that each student 8 participating in single-sex interscholastic events is participating according to the student's 9 sex at the time of the student's birth; and clarifying that these requirements do not apply 10 to co-educational secondary school interscholastic athletic events.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

# §18-2-5c. Birth certificate required upon admission to public school; required notice to local law-enforcement agency of missing children; <u>identifying pupil's sex for the</u> purpose of participating in single-sex interscholastic athletic events.

1 (a) No pupil shall be admitted for the first time to any public school in this state unless the 2 person enrolling the pupil presents a copy of the pupil's original birth record certified by the state registrar of vital statistics confirming the pupil's identity, age, and state file number of the original 3 4 birth record. If a certified copy of the pupil's birth record cannot be obtained, the person so 5 enrolling the pupil shall submit an affidavit explaining the inability to produce a certified copy of 6 the birth record: *Provided*, That if any person submitting such affidavit is in U.S. military service 7 and is in transit due to military orders, a three-week extension shall be granted to such person for 8 providing the birth records.

9 (b) Upon the failure of any person enrolling a pupil to furnish a certified copy of the pupil's 10 birth record in conformance with subsection (a) above, the principal of the school in which the 11 pupil is being enrolled or his <u>or her</u> designee shall immediately notify the local law-enforcement 12 agency. The notice to the local law-enforcement agency shall include copies of the submitted

proof of the pupil's identity and age and the affidavit explaining the inability to produce a certifiedcopy of the birth record.

(c) Within fourteen days after enrolling a transferred pupil, the principal of the school in
 which the pupil has been enrolled or his <u>or her</u> designee shall request that the principal or his <u>or</u>
 <u>her</u> designee of the school in which the pupil was previously enrolled transfer a certified copy of
 the pupil's birth record.

(d) Principals and their designees shall be immune from any civil or criminal liability in
connection with any notice to a local law-enforcement agency of a pupil lacking a birth certificate
or failure to give such notice as required by this section.

22 (e) For the purposes of participating in single-sex secondary school interscholastic athletic 23 events under the control, supervision, and regulation of the West Virginia Secondary Schools 24 Activities Commission pursuant to §18-2-25 of this code, each county school district shall confirm 25 that the sex of the pupil identified on the pupil's original birth certificate, provided upon his or her 26 admission to public school, is the pupil's sex at the time of birth: *Provided*. That if an original birth 27 certificate was not provided or if the birth certificate provided does not indicate the pupil's sex at 28 the time of birth, a signed physician's statement indicating the pupil's sex based solely on the 29 pupil's unaltered internal and external reproductive anatomy must be submitted prior to a pupil's 30 participation in single-sex secondary school interscholastic athletic events.

§18-2-25. Authority of county boards to regulate athletic and other extracurricular activities of secondary schools; delegation of authority to West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission; authority of commission; approval of rules by state board; incorporation; funds; participation by private and parochial schools, and by homeschooled students and by preparatory athletic programs; student participation in single-sex secondary school interscholastic athletic events.

(a) The county boards of education shall exercise the control, supervision, and regulation
 of all interscholastic athletic events, and other extracurricular activities of the students in public

secondary schools, and of those schools of their respective counties. The county board of
education may delegate control, supervision, and regulation of interscholastic athletic events and
band activities to the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission.

6 (b) The West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission is composed of the 7 principals, or their representatives, of those secondary schools whose county boards of education 8 have certified in writing to the State Superintendent of Schools that they have elected to delegate 9 the control, supervision, and regulation of their interscholastic athletic events and band activities 10 of the students in the public secondary schools in their respective counties to the commission. 11 The West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission may exercise the control, supervision, 12 and regulation of interscholastic athletic events and band activities of secondary schools, 13 delegated to it pursuant to this section. The rules of the West Virginia Secondary School Activities 14 Commission shall contain a provision for a proper review procedure and review board and be 15 promulgated in accordance with the provisions of chapter 29A of this code, but shall, in all 16 instances, be subject to the prior approval of the state board. The West Virginia Secondary School 17 Activities Commission, may, with the consent of the State Board of Education, incorporate under 18 the name of West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission, Inc., as a nonprofit, nonstock 19 corporation under the provisions of chapter 31 of this code. County boards of education may 20 expend moneys for and pay dues to the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission, 21 and all moneys paid to the commission, as well as moneys derived from any contest or other 22 event sponsored by the commission, are quasi-public funds as defined in §18-5-1 et seq. of this 23 code, and the funds of the commission are subject to an annual audit by the State Tax 24 Commissioner.

(c) The West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission shall promulgate
reasonable rules providing for the control, supervision, and regulation of the interscholastic
athletic events and other extracurricular activities of private and parochial secondary schools as
elect to delegate to the commission control, supervision, and regulation, upon the same terms

and conditions, subject to the same rules and requirements and upon the payment of the same fees and charges as those provided for public secondary schools. Any such private or parochial secondary school shall receive any monetary or other benefits in the same manner and in the same proportion as any public secondary school.

(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, or the commission's rules, the
 commission shall consider eligible for participation in interscholastic athletic events and other
 extracurricular activities of secondary schools a student who is receiving home instruction
 pursuant to §18-8-1(c) of this code and who:

37 (1) Has demonstrated satisfactory evidence of academic progress for one year in
38 compliance with the provisions of that subsection: *Provided*, That the student's average test
39 results are within or above the fourth stanine in all subject areas;

40 (2) Is enrolled in at least one virtual instructional course per semester, consistent with the
41 applicable virtual instruction policy of the county board in which the home-schooled student lives
42 and the State Board;

43 (3) Has not reached the age of 19 by August 1 of the current school year;

44 (4) Is an amateur who receives no compensation but participates solely for the 45 educational, physical, mental and social benefits of the activity;

46 (5) Agrees to comply with all disciplinary rules of the West Virginia Secondary School
47 Activities Commission and the county board in which the home-schooled student lives; and

48 (6) Agrees to obey all rules of the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission
49 governing awards, all-star games, parental consents, physical examinations, and vaccinations
50 applicable to all high school athletes.

Eligibility is limited to participation in interscholastic athletic events and other extracurricular activities at the public secondary school serving the attendance zone in which the student lives: *Provided*, That home-schooled students who leave a member school during the school year are subject to the same transfer protocols that apply to member-to-member transfers.

Reasonable fees may be charged to the student to cover the costs of participation in
interscholastic athletic events and other extracurricular activities.

57 (e) The West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission shall recognize 58 preparatory athletic programs, whose participants attend a secondary school in West Virginia for 59 academic instruction, as nonparticipating members of the commission solely for the purpose of 60 competing on the national level: *Provided*. That the preparatory athletic program shall pay the 61 same fees as member schools. Such recognition does not entitle the preparatory athletic program 62 to compete against a member school during the regular season or in any commission state 63 championship events. The commission may promulgate an emergency rule pursuant to 64 subsection (b) of this section, if necessary, to carry out the intent of this subsection.

(f) Prior to a student's participation in single-sex secondary school interscholastic athletic
 events, the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission must verify with each county
 board that each student participating in single-sex interscholastic events is participating according
 to the student's sex at the time of the student's birth pursuant to §18-2-5c(e).
 This subsection does not prohibit students from participating in co-educational secondary

school interscholastic athletic events. Students may participate in co-educational secondary
 school interscholastic athletic events without having to comply with the requirements of this
 subsection.
