(c) A provisionally licensed social worker may become a licensed social worker bycompleting the following:

(1) Be continuously employed for four <u>of the last ten</u> years, as a social worker and
 supervised. The board shall promulgate by legislative rule the supervision requirements;

(2) Complete 12 credit hours of core social work study from a program accredited by the
 council on social work education, as defined by legislative rule, within the four-year provisional
 license period;

31 (3) Complete continuing education as required by legislative rule; and

32 (4) Pass an examination approved by the board.

(d) On or before July 1, 2020, the Legislative Auditor shall cause to be performed a
 performance audit of the provisional license to practice as a social worker application process and
 the application process by which a provisional licensee may become a licensed social worker.

(e) Any employee of the Department of Health and Human Resources with a provisional
license as of the effective date of this section who opted to take the department-provided courses
previously allowed has until June 30, 2022, to convert his or her license to a social work license or
provisional license under this section. If the individual cannot or desires not to complete this
process, he or she shall be eligible for registration as provided in §30-30-30 of this code.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to modify the requirements for social workers in West Virginia.
