A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §9-5-31 relating to requiring the Commissioner of the Bureau for Behavioral
Health to engage behavioral health providers, substance use disorder providers, municipal
leaders, and county government leaders to study a breakdown of homeless demographic
information throughout West Virginia; reporting the findings of the study to the President of
the Senate, Speaker of the House of Delegates, and the Joint Committee on Government
and Finance; and providing a date report is due.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 5. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

19	(b) On or before July 1, 2024, the commissioner shall submit a report of the findings of the
20	study to the President of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Delegates, and the Joint Committee
21	on Government and Finance for consideration of legislation that may be appropriate relating to the
22	homeless in West Virginia.
