1	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
2	designated §18B-21-1, §18B-21-2, §18B-21-3, §18B-21-4, and §18B-21-5, all relating to
3	creating the Hunger-Free Campus Act; providing for a short title; establishing the act and
4	providing for a legislative purpose; authorizing the Higher Education Policy Commission to
5	implement program; providing qualifications for campuses to be designated as Hunger-
6	Free zones; allowing for grant funding of Hunger-Free zones; providing for reporting on the
7	impact of any grants; and providing for an effective date.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 21. HUNGER FREE CAMPUS ACT.

### §18B-21-5. Effective date.

1 <u>This article shall take effect immediately.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to "Hunger-Free Campus Act," which requires the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission to establish a grant program to address food insecurity among students enrolled in public institutions of higher education.
