A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
designated §16-67-1 and §16-67-2, all relating to creating a patient's right to refuse
medical treatment from a resident or student when a licensed physician is available and to
require medical professionals to obtain consent for a resident to treat a patient in advance
of the appointment or procedure.
