## House Bill 4960

- A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
  designated §18-2E-8a, relating to adding requirements for a career exploration course to
- 3 grades seven and eight educational instruction.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

### ARTICLE 2E. HIGH QUALITY EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.

#### §18-2E-8a. Requirements for career exploration in seventh and eighth grades.

1 (a) Starting in fiscal year 2024, every student in grade seven or grade eight enrolled in a

2 West Virginia public school district or a public charter school shall complete one or more career

- 3 exploration courses. A student may opt out by submitting a form to the school showing the
- 4 student's parent or legal guardian has consented to the student not participating in the career
- 5 exploration courses pursuant to this section. Such courses may be offered face-to-face, through
- 6 virtual education programs, as online courses, or as hybrid courses consisting of a combination of
- 7 <u>online and in-person instruction.</u>
- 8 (1) All staff teaching a career exploration course must have participated in a career
- 9 exploration professional development course approved by the state board of education. If such
- 10 courses are not currently available for staff teaching a career exploration course, the state board of
- 11 <u>education will instigate the creation of the necessary course or lesson.</u>
- 12 (2) The state board of education will maintain resources that can be utilized or modified for
- 13 the implementation of this section.
- 14 (b) The requirement of this section is in addition to the expectations created in §18-2E-8 of
- 15 this code and shall begin implementation in the 2024-2025 school year.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to add requirements for a career exploration course to grades seven and eight educational instruction.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
