1	(a) The	re is here	eby created tl	ne Office	of the Ins	pector G	Seneral as a	separate and
2	independent operating agency within the department.							
3	(b) The	Office of the	ne Inspector C	General sh	nall be head	led by the	e Inspector G	eneral.
4	(c) The	Inspector	General shall	be appoi	nted by the	Governo	or, subject to	the advice and
5	consent of the	Senate.						
6	(d) The	term of the	e Inspector Ge	eneral is fi	ive years.			
7	(e) At th	ne end of	a term, an Ins	pector Ge	eneral shall	be eligib	le for reappo	intment by the

17	(h) The	Inspector	General shall	be appoin	ited without	regard to	political affil	iation and shall
18	be professional	ly qualified	d through expe	erience or	education i	in at leas	t two of the fo	ollowing areas:
19	(1) The	practice o	f law;					
20	(2) Audi	ting;						

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21	(3) Government operations;
22	(4) Financial analysis;
23	(5) Management analysis;
24	(6) Public administration; or
25	(7) Fraud investigation.
26	(i) The Inspector General shall be paid an annual salary not to exceed \$95,000.
27	(j) The Inspector General:
28	(1) Shall perform inspections, evaluations, and reviews, and provide quality control for all
29	investigations within the department, and supervise all personnel of the Office of the Inspector
30	General;
31	(2) Shall investigate fraud, waste, abuse of departmental funds, and behavior in the
32	department that threatens public safety or demonstrates negligence, incompetence, misfeasance,
33	or malfeasance;
34	(3) Shall cooperate with and coordinate investigative efforts with law enforcement, and
35	where a preliminary investigation establishes a sufficient basis to warrant referral, shall refer such
36	matters to the appropriate prosecuting attorney or the appropriate federal law-enforcement
37	agency; and
38	(4) May subpoena any person or evidence, administer oaths, take and certify affidavits,
39	and take depositions and other testimony for the purpose of investigating fraud, waste, abuse of
40	departmental funds, or behavior in the department that threatens public safety or demonstrates
41	negligence, incompetence, or malfeasance.
42	(A) If a person fails to comply with a lawful order or subpoena issued under this subsection,
43	on petition of the Inspector General or a designated Assistant Inspector General, a court of
44	competent jurisdiction may compel:
45	(i) Compliance with the order or subpoena; or
46	(ii) Testimony or the production of evidence.

- (k) If the Office of the Inspector General is unable to investigate a complaint or allegation because of a conflict of interest, the Office of the Inspector General shall refer the complaint or allegation to the Attorney General for referral to another investigative entity.
- (I) Neither the Governor, the secretary, nor any other person, may impede, interfere, or inhibit the Inspector General from initiating, conducting, or completing any investigation, inspection, evaluation, review, or other activity regarding oversight of any investigation conducted by the Office of the Inspector General.
- (m) The position of the Inspector General shall be governed by the classified-exempt service provisions in §29-6-4 of this code: *Provided*, That, any employees of the Office of the Inspector General shall be governed by the classified service provisions of §29-6-1 *et seq.* of this code and rules promulgated thereunder.
- (n) The Inspector General may employ such professional personnel, investigators, and other personnel, including certified law-enforcement officers, necessary for the proper administration of the office.
- (o) The Inspector General may delegate duties to other employees or obtain services through contract, but the Inspector General is responsible for all official tasks so delegated.
- (p) The Inspector General shall propose legislative and procedural rules in accordance with the provisions of chapter 29A of this code in order to implement provisions of this section and to carry out the duties prescribed therein. The Inspector General may promulgate emergency rules pursuant to §29A-3-15 of this code to effectuate the purposes of this section.
- (q) Reports of investigations are confidential and shall be provided under seal to the Governor, the secretary, and the Joint Committee on Government and Finance on a quarterly basis.
- (r) Reports and documents relating to active investigations involving possible criminal conduct are confidential and are not subject to the provisions of 29B-1-1 *et seq*.

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(s) All agencies and boards listed in §5F-2-1(i) of this code shall keep posted in any
physical office space, when applicable and in a conspicuous place on their website as required by
§5F-1-7 of this code, the office contact information of the Inspector General, including office
location and mailing address, telephone number, facsimile number, office hours, and a secure
electronic means of contacting the office such as a contact portal or other interface.
