A BILL to amend and reenact §5A-3-63 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to prohibitions on contracting with companies that boycott Israel; clarifying that the section applies to exempt agencies; and setting forth an effective date.

1	(a) The Legislature finds that:									
2	(1) The State of Israel is one of the United States' closest allies and international trading									
3	partners; and									
4	(2) In recent years, the State of Israel and Israeli-owned businesses have been the target									
5	of boycotts that attempt to isolate Israel within the international community have served as a									
6	vehicle for spreading anti-Semitism and advocating for the elimination of the Jewish State of									
7	Israel.									
8	(3) The State of West Virginia has an economic and a humanitarian obligation to denounce									
9	and reject the Boycott, Divestment, and Sanctions Movement against Israel, and to prevent the									
10	state or any of its instrumentalities from contracting with companies that engage in the movement;									
11	(b) Definitions. – For the purposes of this section:									
12	(1) "Boycott of Israel" means engaging in actions that are intended to penalize, inflict									
13	economic harm on, or otherwise limit commercial relations with the State of Israel or companies									
14	based in the	e State of Israe	l or in	territories contr	olled by	the State of Is	rael.			
15	(2) "	'Company" mea	ıns a d	corporation, par	tnership	, joint venture,	limited	partnership	o, limited	
16	liability partnership, limited liability company, organization, association, or any other business									
17	entity that has 10 or more employees and operates to earn a profit: <i>Provided</i> , That the term does									
18	not include a sole proprietorship.

all spending units of state government including those otherwise excluded from applicability under

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21 §5A-3-1 of this code and any spending unit that has been exempted from some or all of the 22 requirements of this chapter by either a provision of this chapter or in another provision of this 23 code. 24 (c) Effective July 1, 2022, a public entity may not enter into a contract with a company for 25 goods or services valued at \$100,000 or more unless the contract includes a written certification 26 that the company is not currently engaged in, and will not for the duration of the contract, engage in 27 a boycott of Israel. 28 (d) Any contract that violates the requirements of this section shall be void as against 29 public policy. 30 (e) The Director of the Purchasing Division is authorized to promulgate legislative rules.

- (e) The Director of the Purchasing Division is authorized to promulgate legislative rules including emergency rules, to implement the provisions of this section.
- (f) The amendments made during the regular session of the Legislature, 2024, shall apply on or after the effective date of those amendments.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to clarify that the prohibitions on contracting with companies that boycott Israel in the section apply to exempt agencies.
