A BILL to amend and reenact §20-7-12b of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to boat safety; and requirement of valid driver's license instead of certificate of boating safety education.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 7. LAW ENFORCEMENT, MOTORBOATING, LITTER. §20-7-12b. Boating safety education certificate; valid driver's license.

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c) of this section, beginning on January 1, 2001, no person born on or after December 31, 1986, may operate a motorboat or personal watercraft on any waters of this state without first having obtained a valid driver's license as defined in §17A-1-1 of this code. certificate of boating safety education from this or any other state, which certificate was obtained by satisfactorily completing a course of instruction in boating safety education administered by the United States coast guard auxiliary; the United States power squadron; the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources; any person certified to teach the course administered by West Virginia natural resources boating safety education section personnel; or any person authorized to teach the course prescribed by the national association of state boating law administrators in this or any other state
- (b) Any person who is subject to subdivision (a) of this section shall possess the <u>driver's</u> <u>license</u> <u>certificate of boating safety education</u> when operating a motorboat or personal watercraft on the waters of this state and shall show the <u>certificate valid license</u> on demand of any West Virginia natural resources police officers or other law-enforcement officer authorized to enforce the provisions of this chapter.
- (c) The following persons are exempt from the requirements of subsection (a) of this section:
- 18 (1) A person who is a nonresident of this state and who is visiting the state for 60 days or 19 less in a motorboat or personal watercraft from another state if that person:
 - (A) Is 15 years of age or older; and

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NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require a valid driver's license instead of certificate of boating safety education when operating a boat.
