A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §18B-4-11, relating to requiring state institutions of higher education, to the
extent feasible, to provide to their students without charge and in a manner that protects
student confidentiality, transportation to and from a local hospital for a trained health care
provider to administer a sexual assault forensic medical examination kit where a student
seeks support after experiencing sexual violence.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:_

ARTICLE 4. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION.

§18B-4-11. Medical examinations transportation services for students who seek support

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require state intuitions of higher education, to the extent feasible, to provide to their students without charge and in a manner that protects student confidentiality, transportation to and from a local hospital for a trained health care provider to administer a sexual assault forensic medical examination kit where a student seeks support after experiencing sexual violence.
