- A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
 designated §3-1-52, relating to prohibiting ranked choice voting in elections in West
 Virginia.
 - Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS AND DEFINITIONS.
