increasing the penalty for voluntary manslaughter.

ARTICLE 2. CRIMES AGAINST THE PERSON.

§61-2-4. Voluntary manslaughter; penalty.

Voluntary manslaughter shall be punished by a definite term of imprisonment in the penitentiary which is not less than three <u>five</u> nor more than <u>fifteen twenty-five</u> years. A person imprisoned pursuant to the provisions of this section is not eligible for parole prior to having served a minimum of <u>three five</u> years of his or her sentence or the minimum period required by the provisions of <u>section thirteen</u>, <u>article twelve</u>, <u>chapter sixty-two</u> §62-12-13 <u>of this code</u>, whichever is greater.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to increase the penalty for voluntary manslaughter.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
