## **Senate Bill 816**

1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new chapter, 2 designated §31J-1-1, §31J-1-2, §31J-1-3, §31J-1-4, §31J-1-5, and §31J-1-6, all relating to 3 creating the Truth in Giving Act, providing definitions, establishing penalties, and granting 4 rulemaking authority. Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: **CHAPTER 31J. TRUTH IN GIVING ACT.** 1. TRUTH IN GIVING ACT. ARTICLE §31J-1-1. Short title. 1 This chapter may be cited as the Truth in Giving Act. §31J-1-2. Purpose. Individuals who donate consumer goods that are intended for resale by thrift operators or 1 2 who purchase consumer goods that have been donated for resale are entitled to know if those 3 donations are benefitting non-profit charities or for-profit businesses. §31J-1-3. Definitions. 1 "Drop box" means any publicly accessible container intended to receive donated 2 consumer goods. 3 "Mobile pickup unit" means any automobile used by a thrift operator to receive donated 4 consumer goods. 5 "Thrift operator" means any retailer licensed to conduct business in this state that sells 6 consumer goods that have been obtained by donations. 7 "Thrift sales" means selling consumer goods that were received by the thrift operator via 8 donations. Truth in Giving Act §31J-1-4. requirements. Any thrift operator selling consumer goods that have been obtained via drop boxes, on-site 1

donations at the retailer's location, mobile pickup units, or at-home pickup must provide the

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3 following information to those providing donations and to customers at the retailer's business 4 location: 5 (1) Name of the business that owned the drop box, mobile pickup unit or is providing at-6 home pick-up of donated consumer goods; 7 (2) Name of the business that will be selling consumer goods that have been donated; (3) Name of the entity or entities receiving proceeds from thrift sales and the percentage of 8 9 proceeds from thrift sales going to each entity. Penalties. §31J-1-5. 1 Failure to comply with this chapter shall result in a \$500 fine per occurrence, as determined 2 by the West Virginia Secretary of State's Office Investigations Unit. §31J-1-6. Rulemaking. 1 The West Virginia Secretary of State's Office shall develop rules to implement this chapter.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to inform the public about who receives the proceeds from the sale of donated consumer goods.
