FIRST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION, 2024 FIRST DAY

Charleston, West Virginia, Sunday, May 19, 2024

Pursuant to the proclamation of His Excellency, the Governor, the Honorable Jim Justice, dated the seventeenth day of May, 2024, convening the eighty-sixth Legislature of West Virginia in extraordinary session today (Sunday, May 19, 2024), under the provisions of section seven, article seven of the Constitution of West Virginia, the Senate assembled in its chamber in the state capitol in the City of Charleston at 6:55 p.m., and was called to order by its President, the Honorable Craig Blair.

Prayer was offered by the Honorable Vince S. Deeds, a senator from the tenth district.

The Senate was then led in recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance by the Honorable Amy N. Grady, a senator from the fourth district.

On the call of the roll, the following answered to their names:

Thirty-one members having answered to their names, the President declared the presence of a quorum.

Executive Communications

Senator Blair (Mr. President) laid before the Senate the following proclamation from His Excellency, the Governor, convening the Legislature in extraordinary session, which was read by the Clerk:

STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT Charleston

A PROCLAMATION

By the Governor

I, JIM JUSTICE, by virtue of the authority vested in the Governor by Section 7, Article VII, of the Constitution of West Virginia, do hereby call the West Virginia Legislature to convene in Extraordinary Session at 5:00 PM on Sunday, May 19, 2024, in its chambers in the State Capitol, the City of Charleston, for the limited purpose of considering and acting upon only the following matters:

FIRST: To restore the budgets of the Department of Human Services and the Department of Health, including the Office of Inspector General, provided that certain amounts will be held in reserve accounts that may be accessed by the Secretary of the Department of Health and the Secretary of the Department of Human Services as such amounts may be needed.

SECOND: To supplement and amend the appropriations of public moneys out of the Treasury from the balance of moneys remaining as an unappropriated balance in the State Fund, General Revenue, to the Department of Transportation, Division of Highways, fund 0620, fiscal year 2024, organization 0803, in the amount of \$150,000,000, by supplementing and amending the appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, by increasing an existing item of appropriation.

THIRD: To supplement and amend the appropriations of public moneys out of the Treasury from the balance of moneys remaining as an unappropriated balance in the State Fund, General Revenue, to the Governor's Office – Civil Contingent Fund, fund 0105, fiscal year 2024, organization 0100, in the amount of \$50,000,000 for new State agricultural lab facilities, by supplementing and amending the appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, by adding a new item of appropriation.

FOURTH: To supplement and amend the appropriations of public moneys out of the Treasury from the balance of moneys remaining as an unappropriated balance in the State Fund, General Revenue, to the Governor's Office, fund 0101, fiscal year 2024, organization 0100, in the

amount of \$10,000,000 for the Posey Perry Emergency Food Bank Fund, by supplementing and amending the appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, by adding a new item of appropriation.

FIFTH: To supplement and amend the appropriations of public moneys out of the Treasury from the balance of moneys remaining as an unappropriated balance in the State Fund, General Revenue, to the Department of Education, State Board of Education – State Department of Education, fund 0313, fiscal year 2024, organization 0402, by supplementing and amending the appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, in the amounts of \$3,289,060 and \$27,321,613 to provide funds for increased enrollment and Hope Scholarship funding respectively, by increasing existing items of appropriation.

SIXTH: To supplement and amend the appropriation of public moneys out of the Treasury from the balance of moneys remaining unappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, to reduce the surplus section of the 2025 budget bill to reflect the anticipated passage of certain supplemental appropriations bills contemplated herein, by supplementing and amending the appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025.

SEVENTH: To supplement and amend the appropriations of public moneys out of the Treasury from the balance of moneys remaining as an unappropriated balance in the State Fund, General Revenue, to the Higher Education Policy Commission, Higher Education Policy Commission – Administration – Control Account, fund 0589, fiscal year 2024, organization 0441, by the total amount of \$83,215,351 to provide needed funds for the State's colleges and universities and our students in response to the issues with this year's Free Application for Federal Student Aid ("FAFSA") at the federal level, by supplementing and amending the appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, by adding new items and increasing an existing item of appropriation.

EIGHTH: To supplement and amend the appropriations of public moneys out of the Treasury from the balance of moneys remaining as an unappropriated balance in the State Fund, General Revenue, to the Department of Veterans' Assistance, fund 0456, fiscal year 2024, organization 0613, in the amount of \$2,000,000 for contract nursing expenses, by supplementing and amending the appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, by increasing existing items of appropriation.

and amending the appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, by increasing existing items of appropriation.

NINTH: To supplement and amend Chapter 11, Acts of the Legislature, Regular Session, 2024, known as the budget bill, in Title II from the appropriations of public moneys out of the Treasury in the State Fund, General Revenue, to the Department of Education, State Board of Education – State Aid to Schools, fund 0317, fiscal year 2025, organization 0402, relating to the school aid formula, by supplementing and amending the appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025 by decreasing items of appropriation.

TENTH: To supplement and amend the appropriation of public moneys out of the Treasure from the balance of moncys remaining unappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, to the Department of Administration, Division of Information Services and Communication, fund 2220, fiscal year 2025, organization 0210, Department of Administration, Office of Technology Chief Technology Officer Administration Fund, fund 2531, organization 0231, to reflect the passage of House Bill 5432, which consolidated and reorganized funds under the Department of Administration's Division of Information Services and Communication and the Office of Technology, by supplementing and amending the appropriations for the fiscal year ending in June 30, 2025.

ELEVENTH: To expire funds to the unappropriated balance in the State Fund, General Revenue, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, in the amount of \$83,215,351.25 from the Department of Revenue, State Budget Office, PEIA Rainy Day Fund, fund 7402, fiscal year 2024, organization 0703.

TWELFTH: To expire funds to the balance of the Department of the Arts, Culture, and History, Cultural Facilities and Capitol Resource Match Grant Program Fund, fund 3537, fiscal year 2023, organization 0432, in the amount of \$2,877,636, from the balance of Lottery Net Profits, Division of Culture and History – Lottery Education Fund, fund 3534, organization 0432.

THIRTEENTH: To amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated § 9-5-29a, relating to residential substance use disorder treatment facilities, to prohibit payment to facilities that do not meet certain requirements, to require licensure, to require accreditation, to require the Bureau for Medical Services to make necessary

filings, to set forth specific timeframe to obtain licensure and accreditation, to require residential substance use disorder treatment facility to obtain accreditation within one year of operation, to provide provisions for operation at a new site or new ownership, to require a report, to state that licensed treatment beds are subject to specific provisions, to provide for rulemaking, and to provide a sunset date.

FOURTEENTH: To amend and reenact § 3-5-21 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to political party nomination of presidential electors, to provide that presidential electors shall be nominated by each political party in a manner governed and prescribed by the rules of that state executive committee and not inconsistent with the rules of the national political party, and providing default rules if party rules do not provide procedures to nominate presidential electors.

FIFTEENTH: To amend and reenact § 11B-2-20 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to deposits to the Revenue Shortfall Reserve Fund and Revenue Shortfall Reserve Fund - Part B.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Title I, section three of this bill, the Secretary of the Department of Health shall have the authority to transfer funds within the above appropriations: *Provided.* That no more than five percent of the funds appropriated to one appropriation may be transferred to other appropriations: Provided, however, That no funds from other appropriations shall be transferred to the Personal Services and Employee Benefits appropriation: Provided, further, notwithstanding the above, that for Fiscal Year 2025 the Secretary of the Department of Health shall have additional authority to transfer appropriations between Personal Services and Employee Benefits and other dedicated appropriations within the respective departments to effectuate the 5% average salary increases granted during the 2024 regular legislative session: Provided, further, notwithstanding the above, that for Fiscal Year 2025 the Secretary of Health shall have the authority to make transfers from the Department of Health Reserve (fund 0407, appropriation XXXXX) appropriation to any general revenue funds under the department. Any unexpended balances remaining in the appropriations for Behavioral Health Program (fund 0403, appropriation 21900), Substance Abuse Continuum of Care (fund 0403, appropriation 35400), Office of Drug Control Policy (fund 0403, appropriation 35401), Capital Outlay and Maintenance (fund 0403, appropriation 75500), Indigent Burials (fund 0403, appropriation 85100), and Office of Drug Control Policy – Surplus (fund 0403, appropriation 35402) at the close of the fiscal year 2024 are hereby reappropriated for expenditure during the fiscal year 2025.

The report shall provide an individual accounting on each transfer of funds out of the Department of Human Services appropriation, including the fund and appropriation to which the transfer was made and a detailed explanation of the need for the transfer. At the request of the co-chairs, the report shall be presented in person to the Joint Committee on Government and Finance.

The Secretary shall have authority to expend funds for the educational costs of those children residing in out-of-state placements, excluding the costs of special education programs.

Any unexpended balance remaining in the appropriation Department of Human Services Reserve (fund 0403, appropriation XXXX) as of March 31, 2025 shall revert to the unappropriated surplus balance of General Revenue.

The above appropriation for James "Tiger" Morton Catastrophic Illness Fund (fund 0403, appropriation 45500) shall be transferred to the James "Tiger" Morton Catastrophic Illness Fund (fund 5454) as provided by Article 5Q, Chapter 16 of the W.V. Code.

The above appropriation for WV Works Separate State Program (fund 0403, appropriation 69800) shall be transferred to the WV Works Separate State College Program Fund (fund 5467) and the WV Works Separate State Two-Parent Program Fund (fund 5468) as determined by the Secretary of the Department of Human Services.
