The meeting was called to order by Ms. Douglas, Co-Chairman.

The minutes of the January 9, 1995, meeting were approved.

Ms. Douglas told the Committee that Rick Staton, Chairman of the House Committee on the Judiciary, was present to explain the purpose of the committee on technical corrections. Mr. Staton addressed the Committee and responded to questions. Joe Altizer, Associate Counsel briefed the Committee on a letter that he will send to all State agencies and boards involved in rule-making regarding technical changes and responded to questions from the Committee.

Debra Graham, Committee Counsel reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the Secretary of State, Agencies Designated to Provide Voter Registration Services, and stated that the Secretary of State has agreed to technical modifications.

Ms. Compton moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted. Mr. Anderson, Mr. Ross, Mr. Riggs and Ms Boley voted "No.".

Mr. Altizer explained the rule proposed by the Division of Environmental Protection-Water Resources, Waste Tire Management Rule, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. He responded to questions from the Committee. Dick Cooke, Assistant Chief of Solid Waste Management, answered questions from the Committee.

Mr. Ross moved that the proposed rule be placed at the foot of the agenda. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the Division of Natural Resources, Commercial Sale of Wildlife, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. She responded to questions from the Committee. Gordon Robertson,

Deputy Chief of Wildlife Resources, and Jim Crum, of the Division of Natural Resources, responded to questions from the Committee.

Mr. Ross moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Mr. Gallagher moved that the Committee request authority from the Joint Committee on Government and Finance to meet, when necessary and upon approval of the President and the Speaker, at times other than during scheduled interims and that expense reimbursement be authorized. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the Division of Public Safety, West Virginia DNA Databank, and stated that the State Police have agreed to technical modifications. She answered questions from the Committee. Ted Smith, Supervisor of the State Police DNA lab, responded to questions from the Committee.

Ms. Douglas moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the West Virginia Lottery, Licensees and the Americans With Disabilities Act, and stated that the Lottery has agreed to technical modifications. John Melton, General Counsel of the Lottery Commission, answered questions from the Committee. Ms. Boley asked if the Lottery would be willing to modify the proposed rule to make it clear that curb service is considered a readily achievable step to remove barriers. Mr. Melton agreed to the modification.

Ms. Boley moved that the proposed rule be modified to make it clear that curb service is considered a readily achievable step to remove barriers. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Douglas moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted. Mr. Anderson and Mr. Buckalew voted "No".

Rita Stuart, Associate Counsel, explained the rule proposed by the Board of Miner Training, Education and Certification, REs and Regulations Governing the Safety Training Program for Prospective Surface Coal Miners in West Virginia, and answered questions from the Committee.

Ms. Compton moved that the proposed rule be approved. The motion was adopted.
