The meeting was called to order by Mr. Ross, Co-Chairman.

The minutes of the August 15 and 16, 1999, meetings were approved.

Debra Graham, Committee Counsel, stated that the rule proposed by the *West Virginia Health Care Authority-Certificate of Need Rule*, 65CSR7, had been laid over from the previous meeting, and she explained the modifications proposed by the Health Care Authority.

Mr. Faircloth moved that the proposed modifications be approved. The motion was adopted.

Mr. Faircloth moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham stated that the rule proposed by the West Virginia Health Care Authority-Health Services Offered by Health Professionals, 65CSR17, had been laid over from the previous meeting. She explained the modifications proposed by the West Virginia Hospital Association. Jim Thomas, Counsel for the West Virginia Hospital Association; Michelle Ginberg, Counsel for the West Virginia Medical Association; and Bob Coffield, Counsel for the Health Care Authority, addressed the Committee and responded to questions.

The Committee moves to amend CSR§65-17-2.1 by striking the entire subsection 2.1 and inserting the following language:

2.1 "Diagnostic center" means:

2.1.a. Any private office practice of one or more health professionals licensed, authorized, or organized pursuant to Chapter 30 of the West Virginia Code which offers laboratory or imaging services and in which the total cost of all the equipment required to provide these services exceeds \$2,000,000; provided however, in determining whether the total cost of equipment exceeds \$2,000,000, the cost of studies, surveys, designs, plans, working drawings, specifications, and other activities essential to the acquisition of the equipment shall be included; provided further, that if the equipment is acquired for less than fair market value, the term "cost" includes fair market value; provided further, that the term "cost" also includes a series of expenditures which exceeds \$2,000,000 if the board determines that the sum total constitutes a single expenditure subject to review under the provisions at 65 C.S.R. 7, Section 3.6.a., 3.6.b., and 3.6.c.; or

- 2.1.b. Any facility owned or operated by one or more health professionals licensed, authorized, or organized pursuant to Chapter 30 of the West Virginia Code which offers laboratory or imaging services in a setting that is not ancillary to and functionally integrated with private office practice of such health professionals, regardless of the cost associated with the proposal; or
- 2.1.c. Any facility owned or operated by one or more health professionals licensed, authorized, or organized pursuant to Chapter 30 of the West Virginia Code which offers laboratory or imaging services to patients that are not examined and evaluated in the same

manner as any other patient of the private office practice of such licensed health professionals, regardless of the cost associated with the proposal; or

2.1.d. Any facility owned or operated by one or more health professionals licensed, authorized, or organized pursuant to Chapter 30 of the West Virginia Code which offers laboratory or imaging services to patients in a setting that is licensed by the department of health and human resources/office of health facility licensure and certification, or accredited by the joint commission for the accreditation of healthcare organizations, regardless of the cost associated with the proposal.

The following is a summary of information (to the best of my knowledge) regarding the WV Board of Medicine's recommendation to increase the Medical and Podiatric Licensure Application Fees and Active Biennial Registration Fees from \$200 to \$300.

The WV Board of Medicine last raised these fees 13 years ago in 1986. Since then our revenues (fiscal years) have remained relatively stable or decreased (\$992,551 in '86, \$899,359 in '98) while our disbursements have steadily increased (\$435,230 in '86, \$981,588 in '98'). Our cash balance has declined from \$941,449 in July '87 to \$179,322 June 30, 1999. This past year Board disbursements exceeded revenue by almost \$190,000 (\$859,087 in receipts, \$1,049,028 in disbursements (calendar year): Annual Report to the Legislature, 1998).

The increase in disbursements have been multifactorial:

- 1. Normal costs of doing business have risen in the past 13 years.
- 2. The Legislature has appropriated \$1,000,000 from the Board of Medicine (\$500,000 in both 1988 and 1990).
- 3. New duties and expenses have been added by the Legislature (West Virginia Code 30-1-12, 30-3-10a, 5A-2-15. These items include obtaining an 800 number, addition of a computer guru, transferring over \$3000 per year to PEIA, and the volunteer medical license which costs the Board money to implement.
- 4. DHHR has assessed the Board \$32,000 and \$37,000 the past two years for its services. DHHR also took \$21,565 seven years ago for establishing a uniform health professionals data collection system under West Virginia Code 16-1-10b.

- 5. Our review by the Federation of State Medical Boards this past year included a recommendation that we hire a prosecutor (\$23,000/year) to avoid conflicts involving our in house counsel.
- 6. There are increasing numbers of lawsuits against the Board resulting in increased legal fees. There have been 36 hearings held in the past 5 1/2 years with 1/3 of these being appealed and only one reversal. One of these which has been expensive was when the Board was required to deny licensure to a physician due to child support arrearage under West Virginia Code 48A-5A-5 enacted in 1997.

If the proposed fees are enacted it will make those paid by physicians and podiatrists equivalent or less than attorney license renewal fees in West Virginia (\$150-\$195 annually). I have also reviewed the fees of the other 49 states and 4 districts (Puerto Rico, DC, Guam, and Virgin Islands). Currently there are only seven who charge less than West Virginia and of those the two closest to us, Pennsylvania and Virginia, have requested increases. If the \$100 biennial fee increase is enacted 20 of the other licensing medical boards will still charge as much or more than West Virginia; and of the remaining 33 boards, 14 get additional sources of funding from their states i.e. Department Funds or State General Funds.

If there is no fee increase and the Legislature does not provide alternative funding then the WV Board of Medicine estimates in its budget for fiscal year 2000 that there will be a surplus at year's end of less than \$50,000 which is not felt to be safe and in the public's interest. The proposed increase in fees (\$100 biennially or \$50/year) is expected to bring in an average of \$277,000 additional per year. Based on last year's deficit of \$190,000, an increase of \$50 biennially would bring in \$138,500 and would be insufficient to cover expenses. A \$75 biennial increase would provide an estimated \$207,750 in additional funds.

Finally, I would like to say that of the fifteen members of the West Virginia Board of Medicine who were involved in the decision to recommend a fee increase, eleven of us are either physicians or podiatrists and have to pay the fee ourselves. Obviously we would prefer an alternative source of funding or reducing expenditures. Unfortunately the Board can not control a number of its expenditures if it is to perform its mission.

The Committee moves to modify in CSR §65-7-2.8 by striking the entire subsection 2.8, and by substituting the following language:

"Diagnostic services" means, the offering or development of laboratory or imaging services at a new or existing health care facility or health maintenance organization; provided however, that a health care facility or health maintenance organization already offering one or more laboratory or imaging services, including but not limited to, radiology, ultrasound, mammography, fluoroscopy, nuclear imaging, densitometry, or computerized tomography at its existing facility, and proposing to add at its existing health care facility laboratory or imaging services not otherwise enumerated under subsection 28.1 and not constituting major medical equipment under subsection 2.16.j, shall not be deemed to be engaged in the addition of health care services under subsection 2.16.e of this rule.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this modification is to maintain the status quo. The modification eliminates the capital expenditure threshold for the provision of diagnostic services, while maintaining the flexibility of existing providers of diagnostic services to reasonably upgrade such services at existing facilities.

The Committee moves to modify CSR §65-7-2.14 by striking the entire subsection, and by substituting the following language:

2.14 "Private office practice" means the independent practice of one or more health professionals licensed, authorized, or organized pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 30 of the West Virginia Code which is not controlled directly or indirectly, in whole or in part, by any other person or entity.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this modification is to define the term "private office practice."

The Committee moves to modify CSR §65-7-8.1 by striking "... the applicant may not submit additional information unless it is requested by the board. If ..." and adding "... the board may require the applicant to submit additional information. If no hearing is requested upon the application, and ... " in its place.
