Motion to Re-evaluate Aluminum and Selenium Water Quality Standards

The aquatic life criteria in the Environmental Quality Board's regulations for both aluminum and selenium are currently set at such low levels that dischargers are now (and will in the future) find it very difficult to meet permit limits based on those standards.

While the criteria that have been adopted by the Board for these two standards are at the same level as the national criteria recommended for use, by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, it is well known that national criteria can be more stringent than would be necessary to protect the waters of any one state. This is because national criteria must be stringent enough to protect species that may not exist in any one state or take into account conditions that may not exist in any one state. In fact, I understand that EPA has conducted additional studies on selemium which show that the current standards are over protective and has drafted a new standard that would protect aquatic life while also easing the burden imposed on industry. Likewise, I understand that there is information which suggests or demonstrates that our existing standards for aluminum are stricter than are necessary to protect aquatic life.

I am concerned that before we get too far along with the implementation of standards that dischargers may not be able to meet with traditional treatment technology, we must be sure that our standards are protective of our streams without being overly protective.

To address this concern, I propose and move that we direct counsel to this Committee to review whether there are grounds for easing the selenium and aluminum standards established for the protection of aquatic life and, if so, to provide us at the next meeting of this Committee with a proposal by which the standards might be modified to reflect more appropriate standards that are no more stringent than necessary to meet the requirements of federal and state water pollution control acts.

This re-evaluation should be for the purpose of determining whether a standard for these parameters is necessary at all, and, if so, to determine what the standard should be to be

. I hereby move to revise 46 CSR I to add a new subsection 8.5 to read as follows: ¶

"8.5. Altunium and Selenium Criteria. Working in conjunction with the Director and DEP Advisory Board, the Environmental Quality Board shall undertake a re-evaluation of the aquatic life criteria for both aluminum and selenium as set forth in Appendix C. Table 1. Such re-evaluation shall be submitted to the Legislative Rulemaking Roview Committee on or before September 1, 2004. The existing aquatic life for aluminum and selenium as set forth in Appendix C. Table 1, shall expire and have no force and effect on and after July 1, 2005, unless extended or modified by the Legislature prior to that date. ¶

75 Water Quality Criteria Toxics Revisions

- The EQB has modified its current water quality standards to include an additional 70 toxic pollutants found in USEPA's National Recommended Water Quality Criteria: 2002.
- Based on the changes between current standards and the proposed there are 70 new compounds added to the list. An additional 5 compounds (aldrin, arsenic, copper, nickel, and pentachlorophenols) had aquatic life standards added.
- Prior to approving such wholesale adoption of USEPA's <u>Recommended</u> toxic pollutant criteria, the Legislature should be presented with justification as to the need and selection of these approximate 75 revisions to the state Water Quality <u>Standards</u>. The EQB's rulemaking record does not contain such information.
- The Legislature should also be presented with a more thorough fiscal statement regarding each of these revisions.
- MOTION: It is hereby moved that 46 CSR 1, Appendix E as modified by the EQB and relabeled as Appendix C be returned to its original text with regard to the 70 new compounds and 5 revisions to aldrin, arsenic, copper, nickel, and pentachlorophenols and that the EQB shall undertake a written justification for each new criteria or revision to existing criteria taking into consideration the unique water quality issues in West Virginia, prior to proposing addition thereof to 46 CSR 1, for review by the Legislative Rulemaking Review Committee. Such justification shall also address the fiscal implications for each revision.

Changes to Water Quality Standards to Clarify that the Category A Use does not Apply State-wide December 9, 2003

1. Delete 46 C.S.R. 1-5.2.c and replace it with the following:

5.2.c If a discharge will cause or contribute to concentrations of pollutants which exceed criteria for the protection of human health set forth in Appendix C at a public water supply intake, such discharge shall not be allowed unless a mixing zone has been assigned by the Director, after consultation with the Commissioner of the West Virginia Bureau of Public Health, to prevent interference with the Category A use. Human health criteria may be exceeded within an assigned mixing zone, but shall be met at the edge of the assigned mixing zone. Mixing zones for human health criteria shall be sized to prevent significant human health risks and shall be developed using reasonable assumptions about exposure pathways. In assessing the potential human health risks of establishing a mixing zone upstream from a drinking water intake, the Chief shall consider the cumulative effects of multiple discharges and mixing zones on the drinking water intake.

- 2. Delete Section 5.2.h.6.
- 3. Add the following as the third sentence in Section 6.1:

Only those waters at the point of intake for a public water supply are designated for Water Supply, Public (Category A).

4. Delete Section 6.2 and replace it with the following:

6.2 Category A - Water Supply, Public - This category is used to describe surface waters which, after conventional treatment, are regularly used for public consumption. Compliance with the Category A criteria in Appendix D, Table 1, will be determined at the surface water intakes for the public water supplies identified in Appendix B.

- 6. Restore the list of public water supplies in Appendix B.
