On motion of Senator Swope, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

S.B. 281 – Removing residency requirement for persons applying for reappointment to municipal police dept

S.B. 552 – Requiring contracts of \$25,000 or more be competitively bid

Chairman Maynard requested unanimous consent of the Committee to request that 2nd reference to Finance be dispensed with. No objection was heard.
